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# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY INTERNATIONAL TRADE REPORT

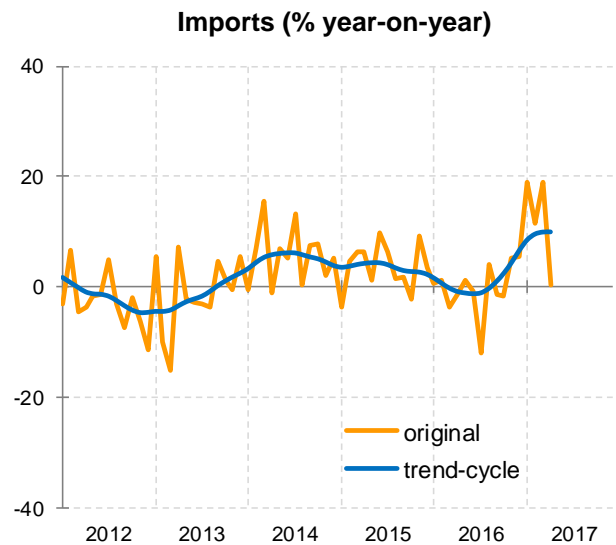
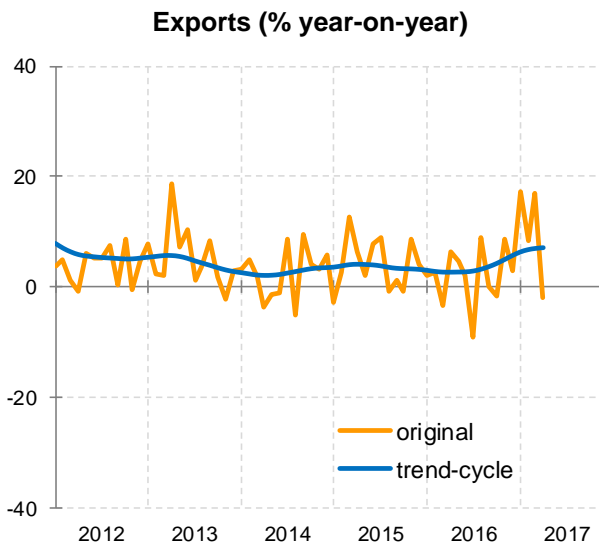
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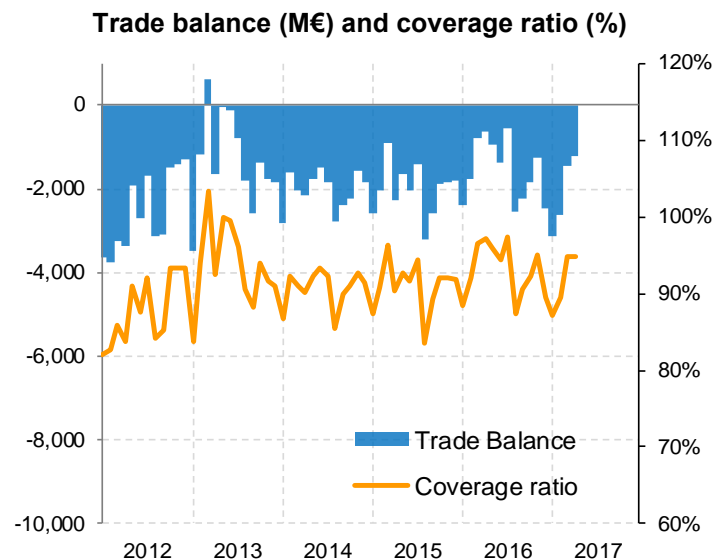


## APRIL 2017

In April 2017, **Spain's exports decreased by 2.0%** year-on-year in nominal terms to 21,796.2 million euros, whereas **imports grew by 0.5%** to 22,995.0 million euros. With seasonally adjusted data, exports rose by 7.5% year-on-year and imports by 10.7%. In **real terms**, exports fell by 2.7% year-on-year, as export prices increased by 0.7%, and imports decreased by 4.4%, as import prices grew by 5.1%. In nominal terms on a **month-on-month** basis, exports and imports fell by 16.9%. With seasonally adjusted data, exports declined by 1.5% month-on-month and imports by 1.9%.

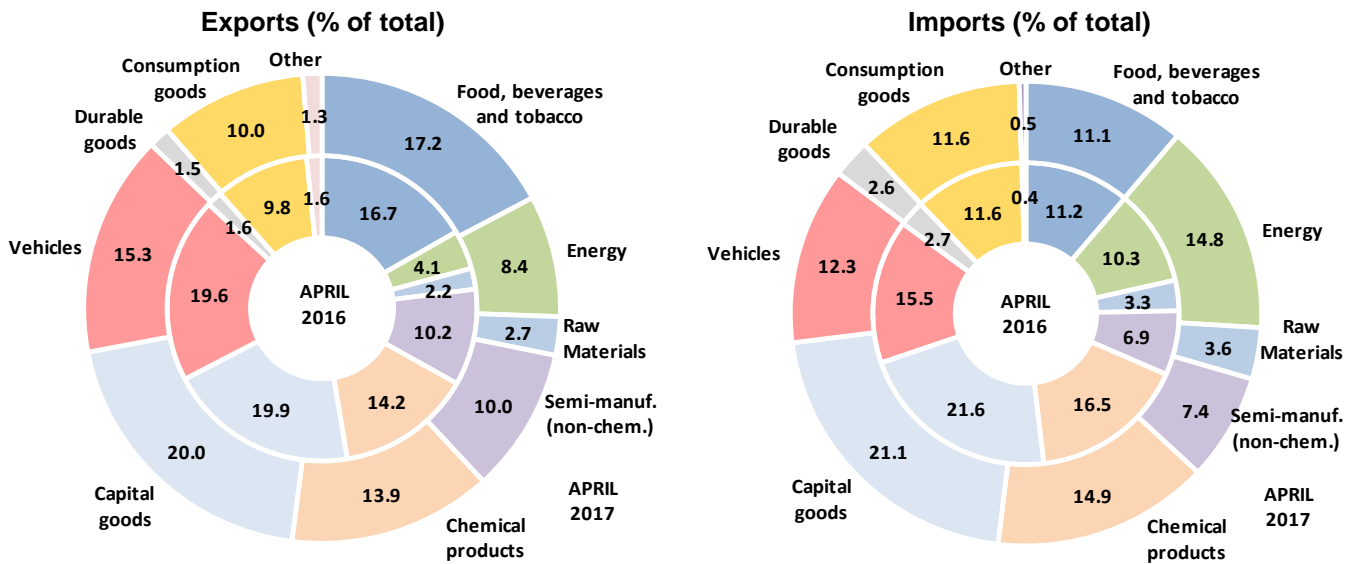


Spain's **trade balance** registered a deficit of 1,198.8 million euros, up from a deficit of 637.3 million euros in April 2016 (provisional data). The export/import **coverage ratio** reached 94.8%, 2.4 percentage points lower than in the same month of 2016 (97.2% in April 2016 with provisional data). The **non-energy trade balance** reached a surplus of 391.3 million euros, down from a surplus of 797.6 million in the same month of 2016. The **energy trade deficit** fell by 10.8% year-on-year to 1,590.1 million euros (compared to a deficit of 1,434.8 million euros in April 2016).



### Sectoral data

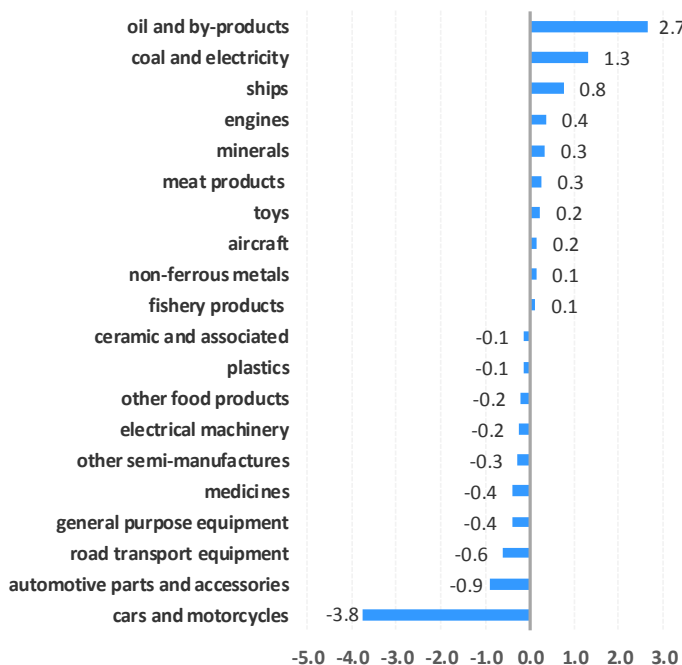
Spain's **main exporting sectors** in April 2017 were *capital goods* (representing 20.0% of total exports and declining by 1.8% year-on-year), *food, beverages and tobacco* (17.2% of total, increasing by 1.2%), *vehicles* (15.3% of total, dropping by 23.7%) and *chemical products* (13.9% of total, falling by 4.4%).



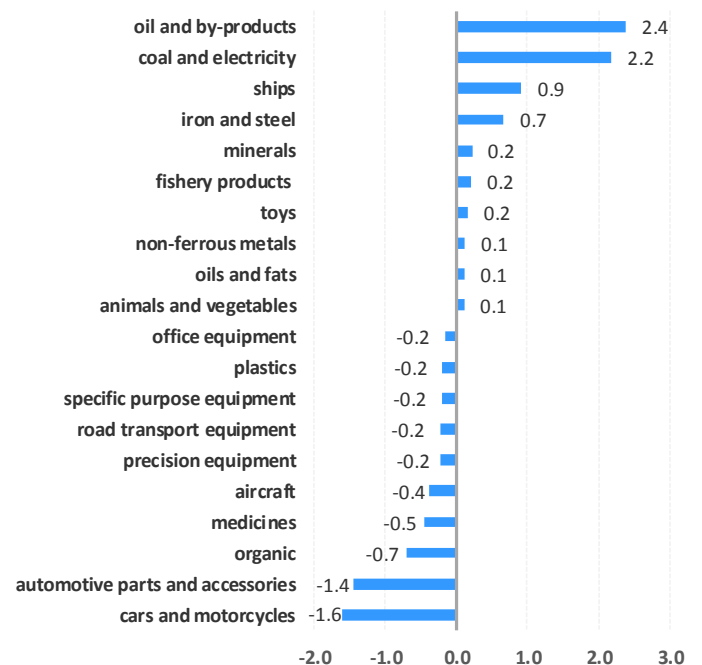
The **most significant sectors of Spain's imports** were *capital goods* (representing 21.1% of total imports and decreasing by 1.8% year-on-year), *chemical products* (14.9% of total, shrinking by 9.4%), *energy* (14.8% of total, advancing by 45.2%) and *vehicles* (12.3% of total, diminishing by 19.7%).

Among **subsectors**, the **largest contributions** to the annual change in Spain's **exports** in April 2017 (down by 2.0%) came from *oil and by-products* (2.7 points), *coal and electricity* (1.3 points) and *ships* (0.8 points). The major negative contributions corresponded to *cars and motorcycles* (-3.8 points), *automotive parts and accessories* (-0.9 points) and *road transport equipment* (-0.6 points).

Exports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)



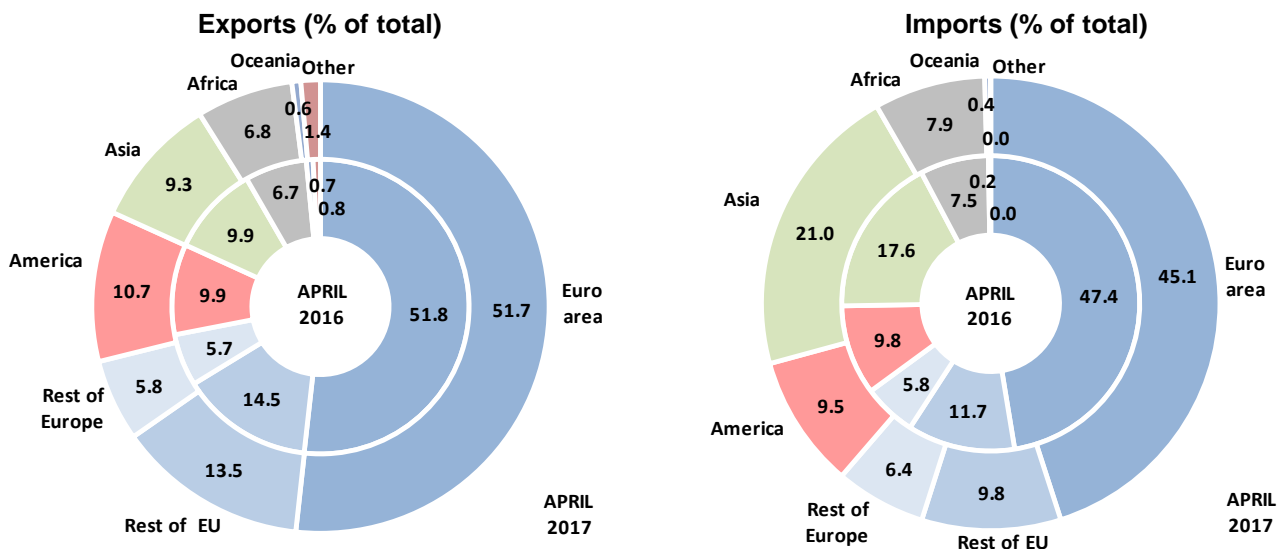
Imports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)



The **subsectors with the most positive contribution** to the annual change in Spain's **imports** in April 2017 (up by 0.5%) were *oil and by-products* (2.4 points), *coal and electricity* (2.2 points) and *ships* (0.9 points). The major negative contributions corresponded to *cars and motorcycles* (-1.6 points), *automotive parts and accessories* (-1.4 points) and *organic chemical products* (-0.7 points).

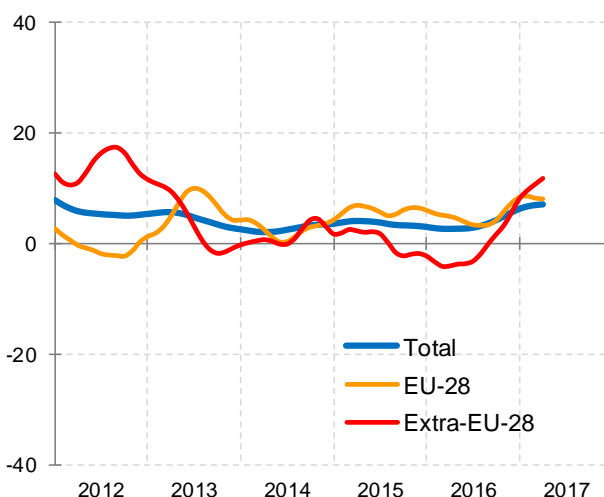
## Geographic data

Exports to the **European Union** accounted for 65.3% of total exports in April 2017 (down from 66.2% in April 2016) and fell by 3.4% year-on-year. Exports to the **euro area** accounted for 51.7% (down from 51.8% in April 2016) and decreased by 2.1%. Exports to **non-EU countries** accounted for 34.7% of total exports (up from 33.8% in April 2016) as they increased by 0.7% year-on-year.

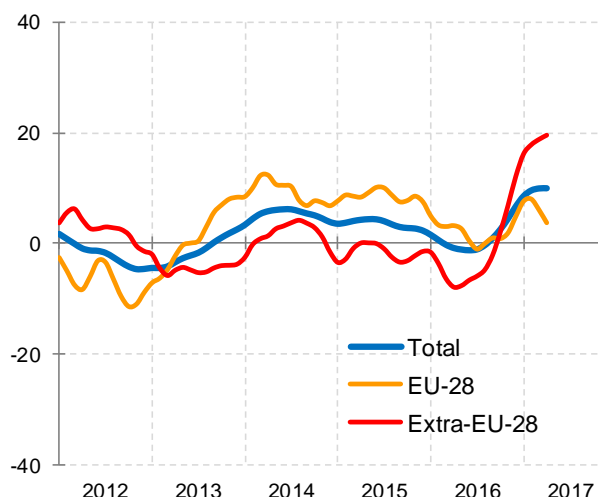


Imports from the **European Union** accounted for 54.9% of total imports in April 2017 (down from 59.1% in April 2016) and diminished by 6.7% year-on-year. Imports from the **euro area** represented 45.1% (down from 47.4% in April 2016) and decreased by 4.5%. Imports from **non-EU countries** accounted for 45.1% of total imports in April 2017 (up from 40.9% in April 2016) as they increased by 10.9% year-on-year.

Exports EU and extra-EU (% y-o-y trend-cycle)



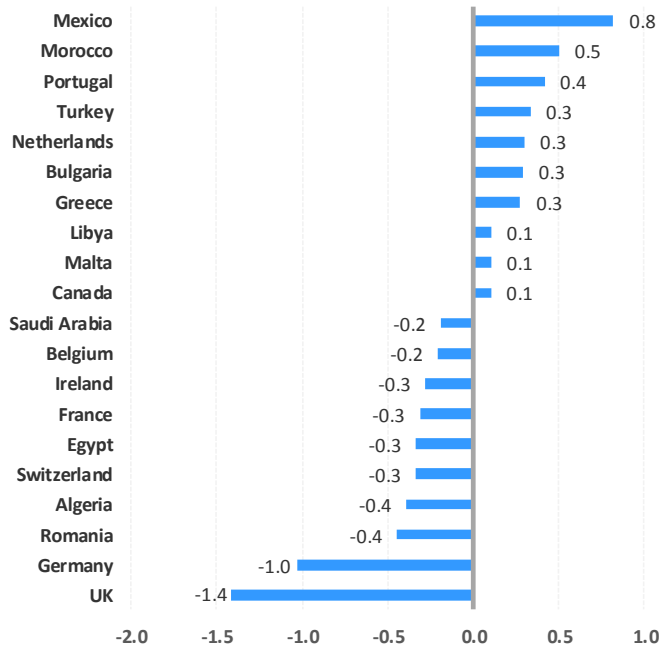
Imports EU and extra-EU (% y-o-y trend-cycle)



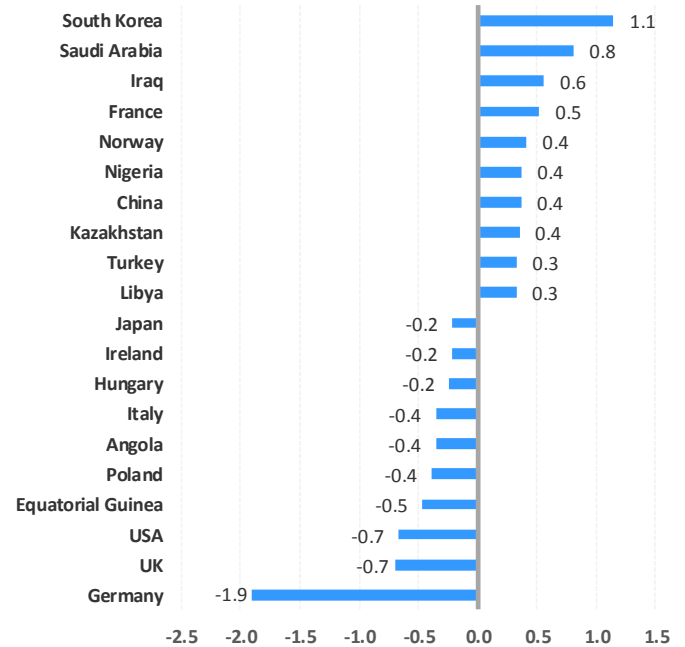
**Trade balance with the European Union** showed in April 2017 a surplus of 1,607.8 million euros (up from a surplus of 1,203.5 million in April 2016) and a surplus of 914.8 million euros with the euro area (662.5 million surplus in April 2016). **Trade deficit with the rest of the world** increased to 2,806.7 million euros (from a deficit of 1,840.8 million euros in April 2016).

The **destinations with the largest contributions** to the annual change in Spain's **exports** in April 2017 (down by -2.0%) were Mexico (0.8 percentage points), Morocco (0.5 points), Portugal (0.4 points) and Turkey (0.3 points). Those destinations with the largest negative contributions were the United Kingdom (-1.4 points), Germany (-1.0 points), Romania (-0.4 points) and Algeria (-0.4 points).

Regarding **imports**, the **countries with the largest contributions** to the annual change in Spain's **imports** in April 2017 (up by 0.5%) were South Korea (1.1 percentage points), Saudi Arabia (0.8 points), Iraq (0.6 points) and France (0.5 points). The destinations with the largest negative contributions were Germany (-1.9 points), the United Kingdom (-0.7 points), the United States (-0.7 points) and Equatorial Guinea (-0.4 points).

### International data

**In comparison to other geographical areas**, Spain's exports of goods decreased by 2.0% year-on-year in April, a higher decrease than that of the euro area (-1.4%) and the European Union (-1.5%). Within the European Union, exports also fell in Germany (-2.9%), France (-3.8%) and Italy (-2.8%), while those of the United Kingdom rose (6.0%). Outside the European Union, the United States exports increased by 4.3% year-on-year, China's by 4.2% and Japan's by 7.5%.



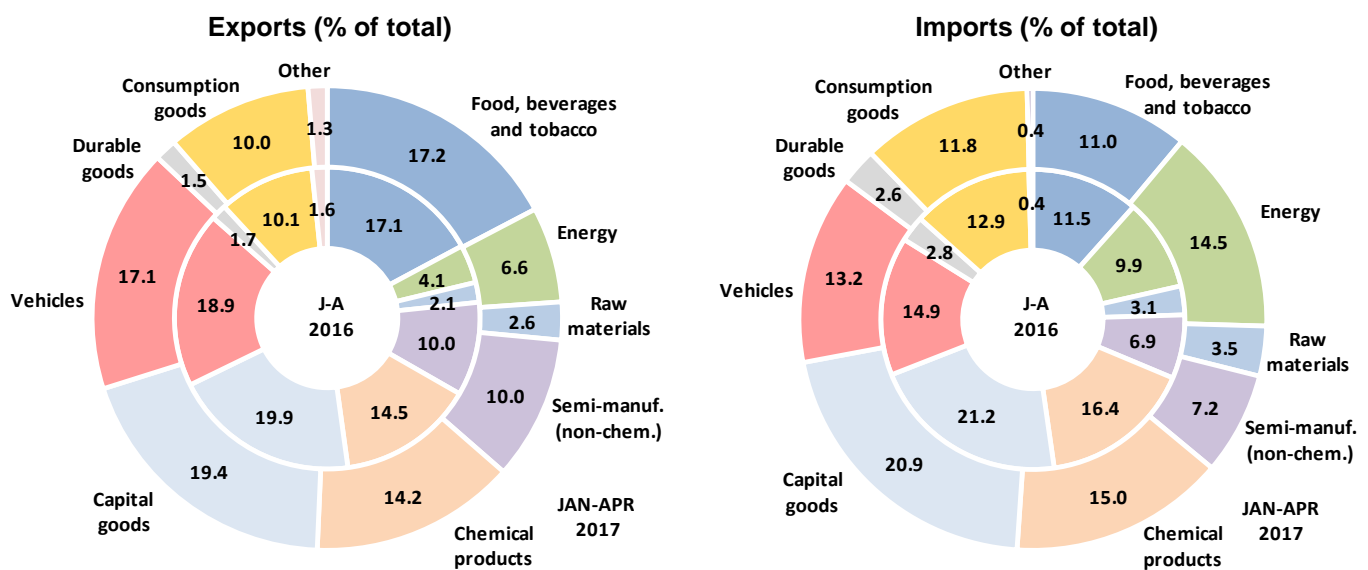
## JANUARY – APRIL 2017

**Spain's exports augmented by 9.8%** in the period of January-April 2017 compared to the same period of 2016 to 91,537.7 million euros, whereas imports expanded by 12.4% year-on-year to 99,935.9 million euros. In real terms, exports grew by 9.0% year-on-year, as export prices increased by 0.8%, and imports augmented by 4.8% year-on-year, as import prices went up by 7.2%.

**Spain's trade deficit** increased to 8,398.1 million euros compared to the same period of 2016 (deficit of 5,580.8 million euros). The export/import **coverage ratio** reached 91.6%, 2.1 percentage points lower than in the same period of 2016 (93.7%, provisional data). The **non-energy trade balance** reached a deficit of 20.0 million euros, compared to a deficit of 189.8 million euros in January-April 2016, whereas the **energy trade deficit** increased by 55.4% year-on-year to 8,378.1 million euros.

### Sectoral data

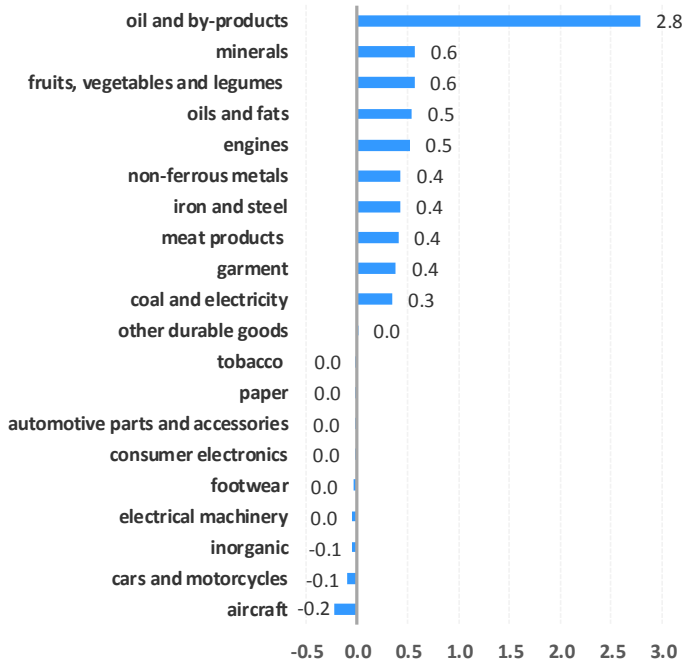
Spain's **main exporting sectors** in the period of January-April were *capital goods* (representing 19.4% of total exports, increasing by 7.2% year-on-year), *food, beverages and tobacco* (17.2% of total, growing by 10.8%), *vehicles* (17.1% of total, falling by 0.7%) and *chemical products* (14.2% of total, increasing by 7.5%).



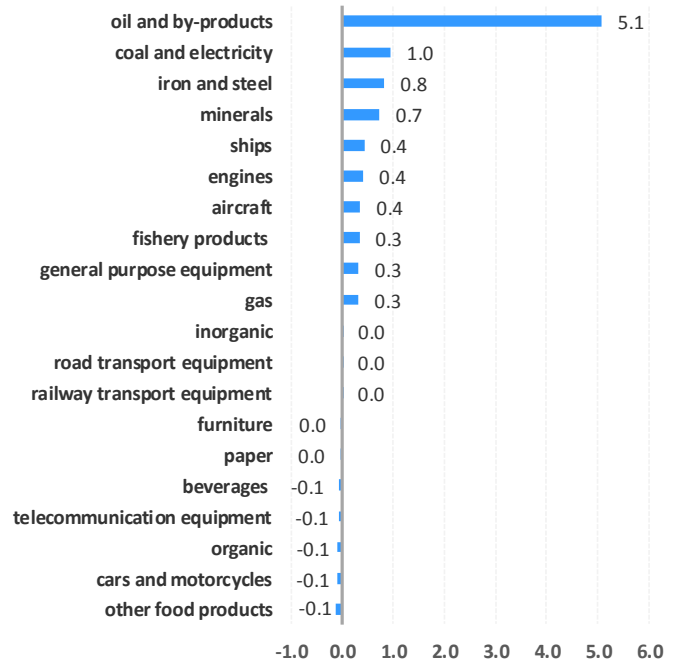
The **largest shares by sector of Spain's imports** were those of *capital goods* (representing 20.9% of total and advancing by 10.7% year-on-year), *chemical products* (15.0% of total imports, rising by 2.7%), *energy* (14.5% of total imports, growing by 64.2%) and *vehicles* (13.2% of total imports, shrinking by 0.4%).

Among **subsectors**, the largest contributions to the annual change in Spain's **exports** (up by 9.8%) were *oil and by-products* (2.8 percentage points), *minerals* (0.6 points) and *fruits, vegetables and legumes* (0.6 points). On the other hand, the major negative contributions by subsectors corresponded to *aircraft* (-0.2 points), *cars and motorcycles* (-0.1 points), and *inorganic chemical products* (-0.1 points).

**Exports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)**



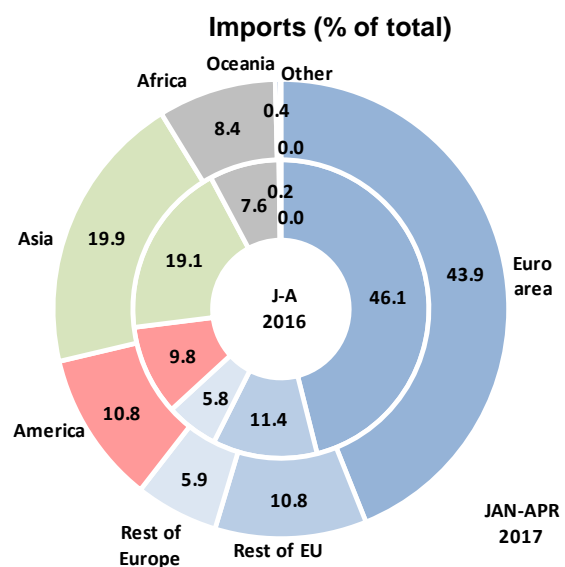
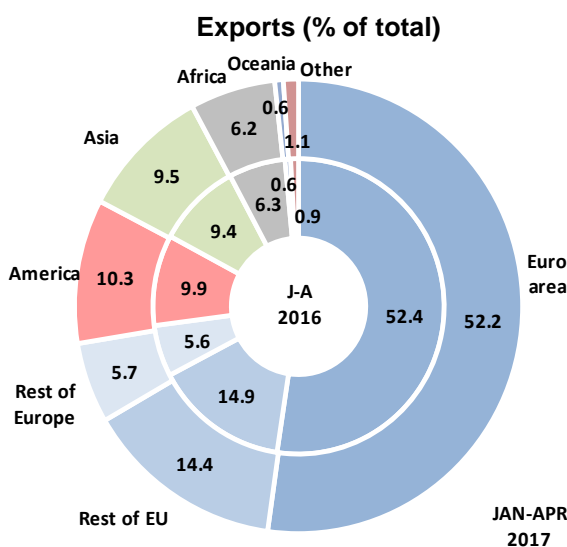
**Imports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)**



The **subsectors with most positive contributions** to the annual change in Spain's **imports** in January-April 2017 (up by 12.4%) were *oil and by-products* (5.1 points), *coal and electricity* (1.0 points) and *iron and steel* (0.8 points). The major negative contributions corresponded to *other food products* (-0.1 points), *cars y motorcycles* (-0.1 points) and *organic chemical products* (-0.1 points).

**Geographic data**

Exports to the **European Union** accounted for 66.6% of total exports in the period (down from 67.3% in the same period of 2016) and advanced by 8.8% year-on-year, while exports to the **euro area** accounted for 52.2% of total (52.4% in the same period of 2016) and advanced by 9.5%. Exports to the **rest of the world** accounted for 33.4% of total exports (32.7% in the same period of 2016) and advancing by 12.0% year-on-year.



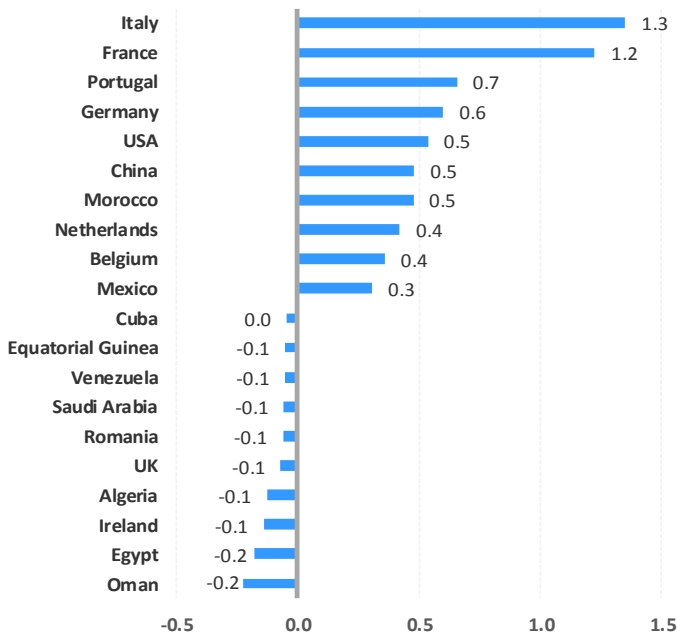
Imports from the **European Union** accounted for 54.7% of total imports in January-April 2017 (down from 57.5% in the same period of 2016) and went up by 6.9% year-on-year. Imports from the **euro area** accounted for 43.9% (46.1% in the same period of 2016) and advanced by 7.1%. Imports from the **rest of**

**the world** accounted for 45.3% of total imports (42.5% in the same period of 2016) and increased by 19.8% year-on-year.

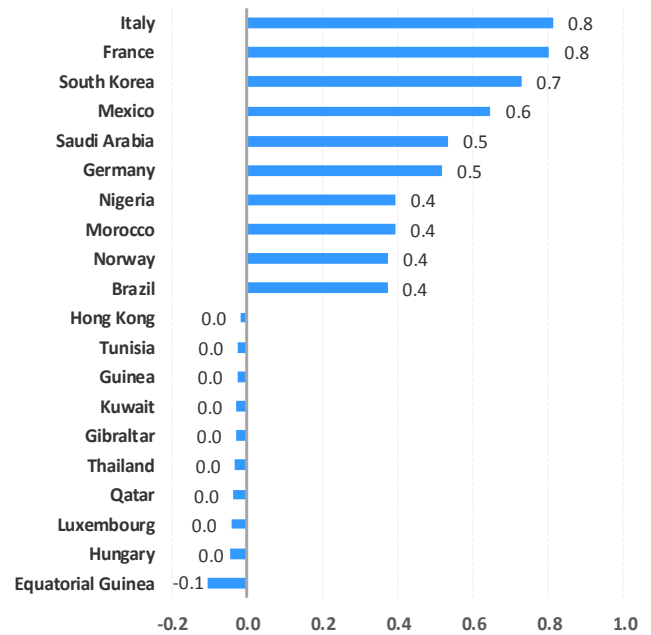
**Spain's trade surplus with the European Union and with the euro area** increased to 6,353.7 million euros and to 3,918.5 million euros respectively, up from surpluses of 4,958.3 million and 2,692.4 million euros in the same period of the previous year. The **trade deficit with the rest of the world** increased by 40.0% year-on-year to 14,751.8 million euros.

In terms of **contribution to the annual change of exports** (up by 9.8%), the main contributions were those of Italy (1.3 percentage points), France (1.2 points), Portugal (0.7 points) and Germany (0.6 points). Those destinations with the largest negative contributions were Oman (-0.2 points), Egypt (-0.2 points), Ireland (-0.1 points) and Algeria (-0.1 points).

**Imports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)**



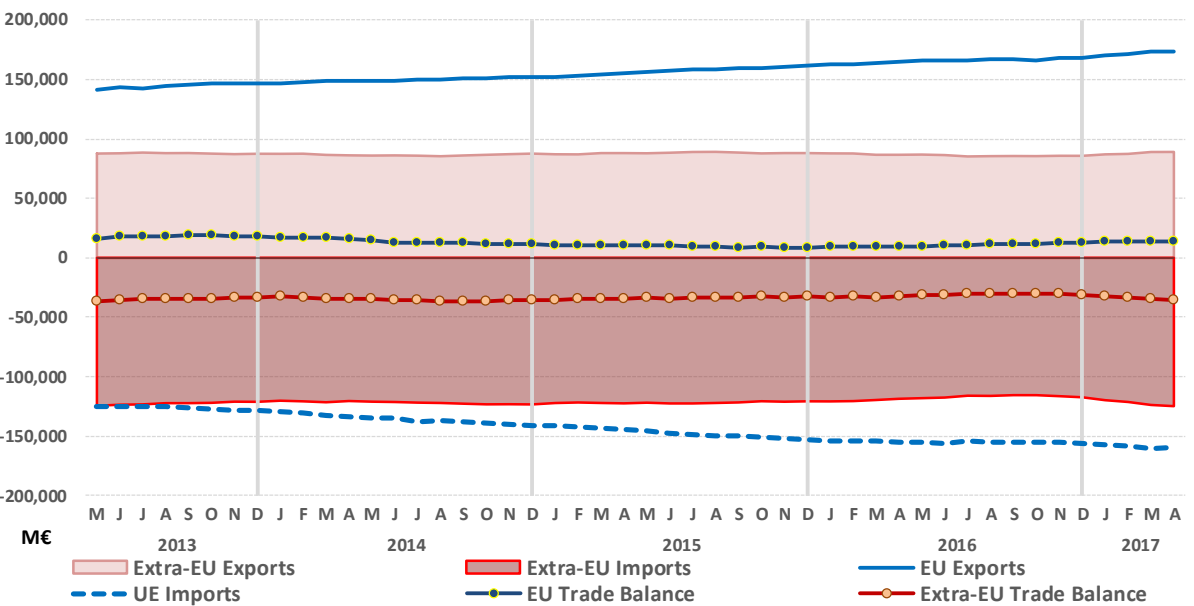
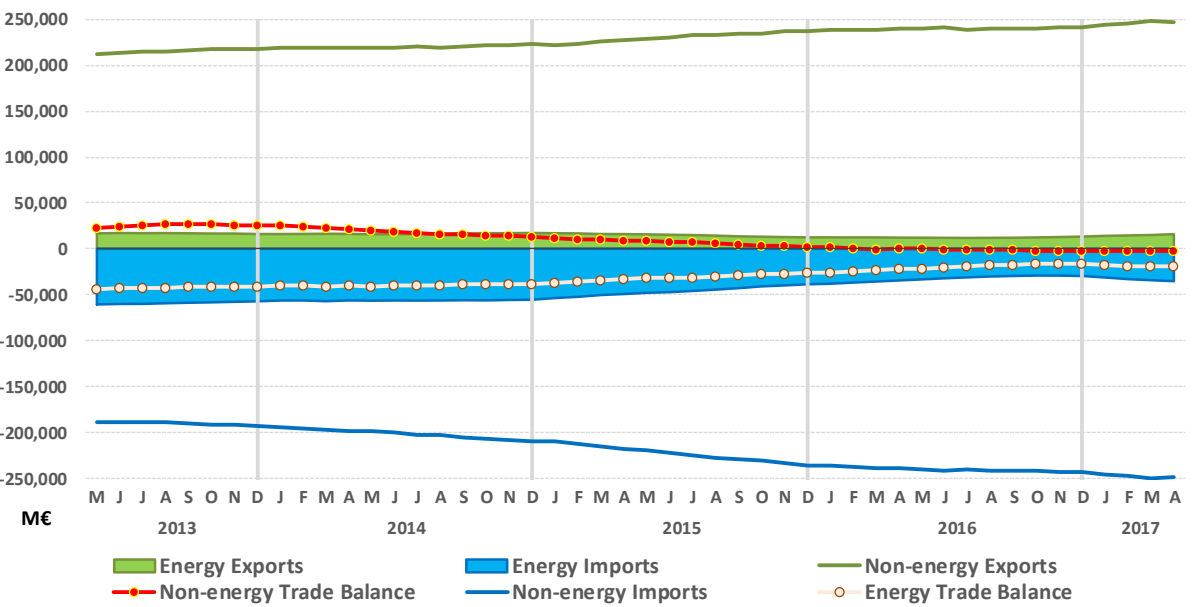
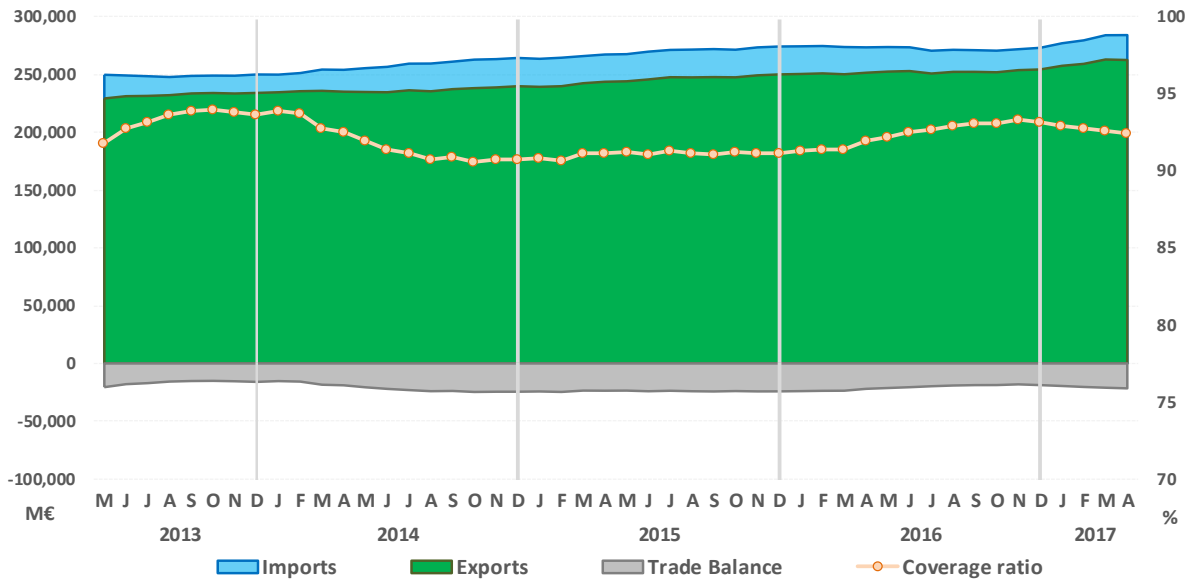
Regarding **imports**, the **countries with the largest contribution** to the annual change in Spain's imports in the period (up by 12.4%) were Italy (0.8 percentage points), France (0.8 points), South Korea (0.7 points) and Mexico (0.6 points). The destination with the largest negative contribution was Equatorial Guinea (-0.1 points).

In the period January-April, the number of **Spanish exporters** expanded by 1.2% year-on-year to 86,464 exporters, out of which 27,246 had already exported at least 50,000 euros worth of goods in the period, 1.5% more than in the same period of 2016. With regard to regular exporters (those that have already exported in the current year as well as in each of the three preceding years), they amounted to 44,440 in the period, 51.4% of total exporters and 1.8% more than in the same period of 2016. Their exports reached 87,416.8 million, 95.5% of total exports and 10.0% more than in the same period of the previous year.

### International data

**In comparison to other geographical areas**, Spain's exports of goods augmented by 9.8% year-on-year in the period of January-April 2017, a higher rate than those attained by the euro area (7.2%) and the European Union (7.2%). Within the European Union, exports also increased in Germany (5.5%), France (2.3%), Italy (6.6%) and the United Kingdom fell (17.4%). Outside the European Union, the United States exports increased by 6.7% year-on-year, China's by 4.2% and Japan's by 8.2%
