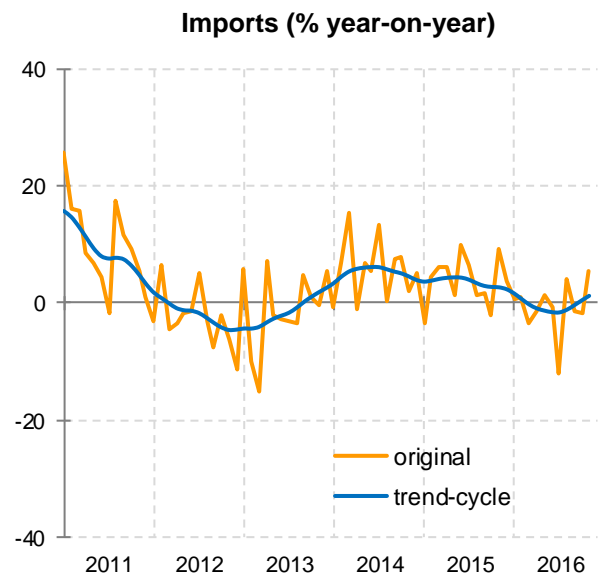
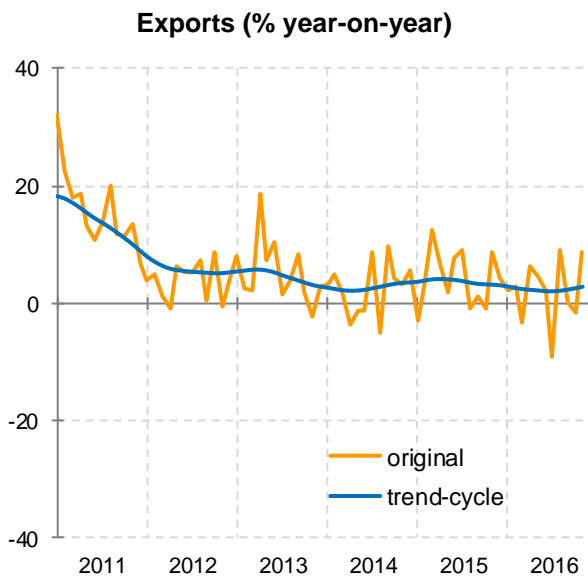

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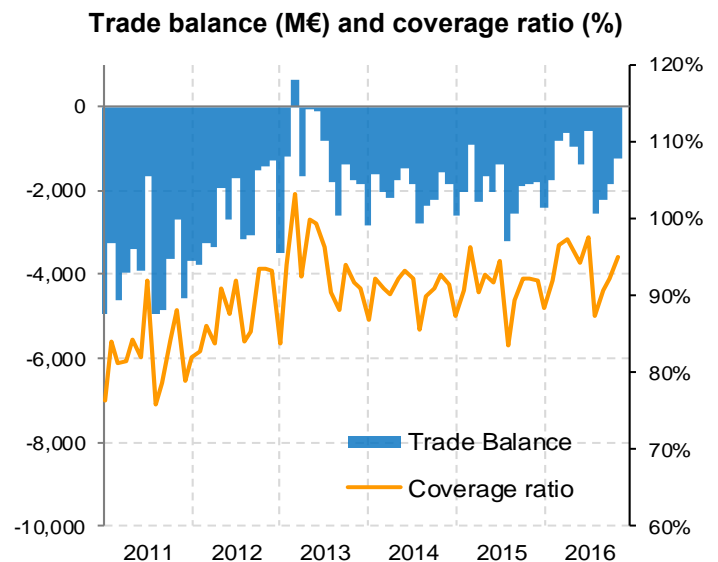


## NOVEMBER 2016

In November 2016, **Spain's exports increased by 8.5%** year-on-year in nominal terms to 23,506.9 million euros, whereas **imports advanced by 5.3%** to 24,753.2 million euros. With seasonally adjusted data, exports grew by 7.4% year-on-year, while imports increased by 3.9%. In **real terms**, exports rose by 9.3% year-on-year, as export prices decreased by 0.7%, and imports grew by 7.0%, as import prices diminished by 1.5%. In nominal terms on a **month-on-month** basis, exports increased by 7.8% and imports advanced by 4.7%. With seasonally adjusted data, exports advanced by 5.7% month-on-month and imports increased by 3.2%.

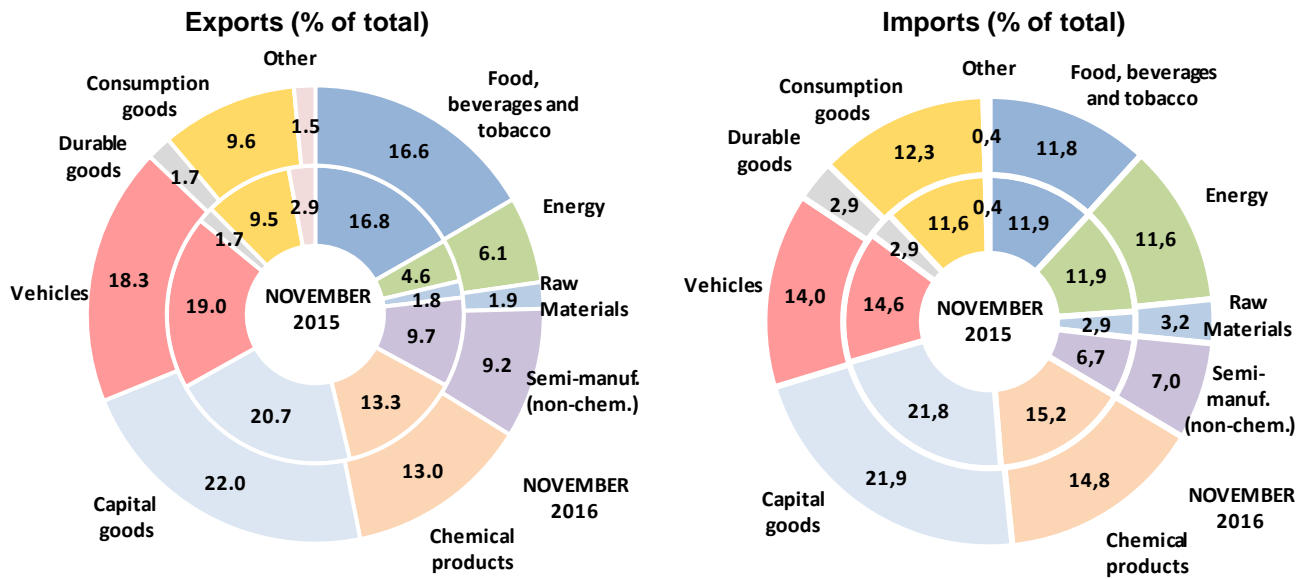


Spain's **trade balance** registered a deficit of 1,246.3 million euros, down from a deficit of 1,849.7 million euros in November 2015 (provisional data). The export/import **coverage ratio** reached 95.0%, 2.9 percentage points higher than in the same month of 2015 (92.1% in November 2015 with provisional data). The **non-energy trade balance** reached a surplus of 192.1 million euros, in contrast to a deficit of 41.9 million in the same month of 2015. The **energy trade deficit** fell by 20.4% year-on-year to 1,438.4 million euros (compared to a deficit of 1,807.7 million euros in November 2015).



### Sectoral data

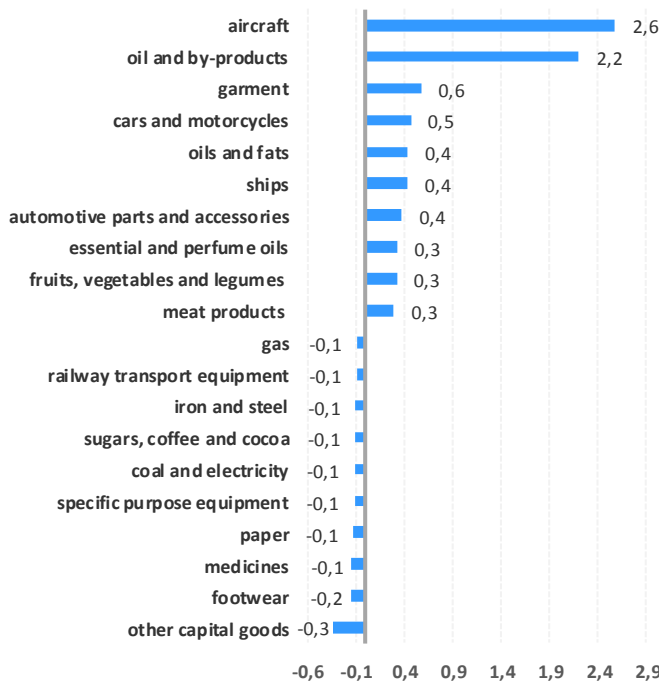
Spain's **main exporting sectors** in November 2016 were *capital goods* (representing 22.0% of total exports and surging by 15.6% year-on-year), *vehicles* (18.3% of total, rising by 4.5%), *food, beverages and tobacco* (16.6% of total, rising by 7.7%) and *chemical products* (13.0% of total, surging by 6.1%).



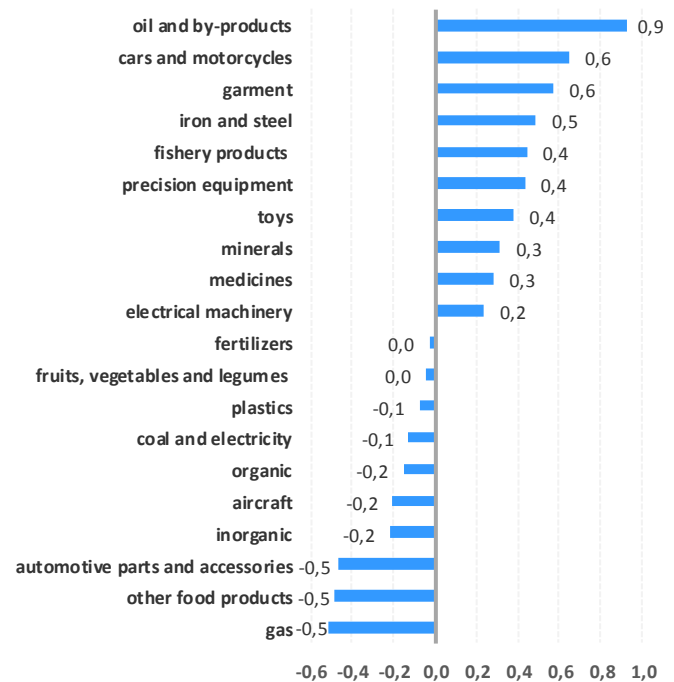
The most significant sectors of Spain's imports were *capital goods* (representing 21.9% of total imports and growing by 6.0% year-on-year), *chemical products* (14.8% of total, expanding by 2.4%), *vehicles* (14.0% of total, advancing by 1.2%) and *consumption goods* (12.3% of total, surging by 11.5%).

Among subsectors, the largest contributions to the annual change in Spain's exports in November 2016 (up by 8.5%) came from *aircraft* (2.6 points), *oil and by-products* (2.2 points) and *garment* (0.6 points). The major negative contributions corresponded to *other capital goods* (-0.3 points), *footwear* (-0.2 points) and *medicines* (-0.1 points).

Exports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)



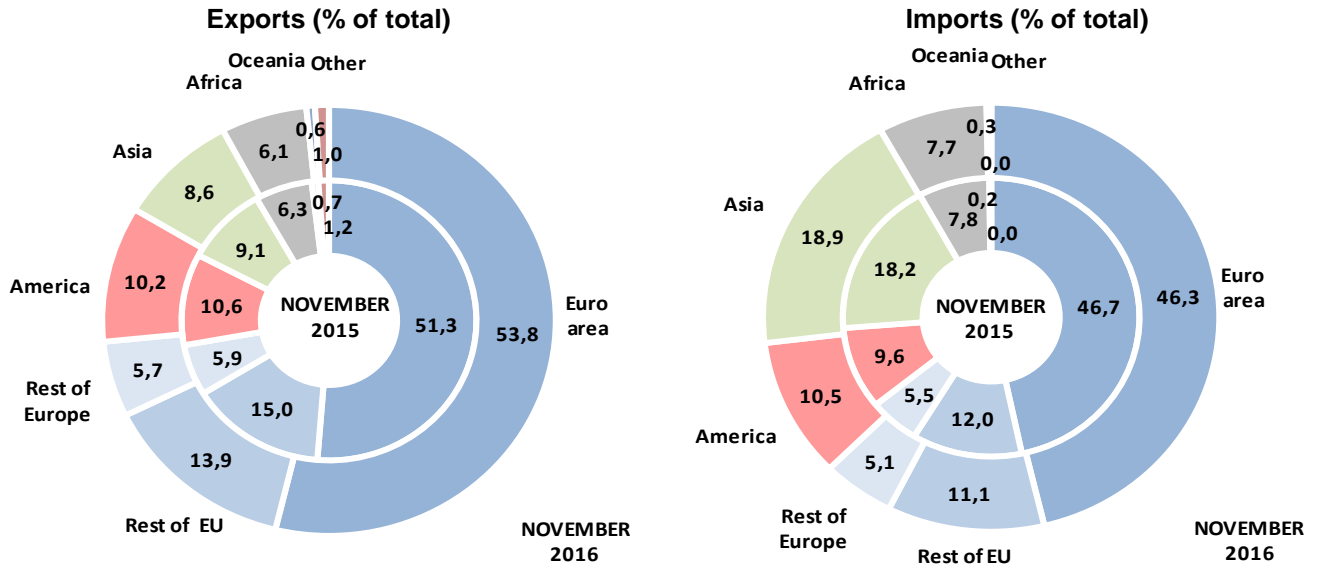
Imports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)



The subsectors with the most positive contribution to the annual change in Spain's imports in November 2016 (up by 5.3%) were *oil and by-products* (0.9 points), *cars and motorcycles* (0.6 points) and *garment* (0.6 points). The major negative contributions corresponded to *gas* (-0.5 points), *other food products* (-0.5 points) and *automotive parts and accessories* (-0.5 points).

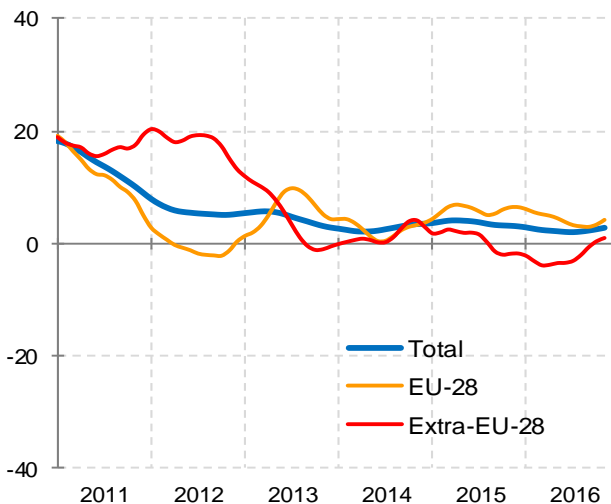
## Geographic data

Exports to the **European Union** accounted for 67.7% of total exports in November 2016 (up from 66.3% in November 2015) and increased by 11.0% year-on-year. Exports to the **euro area** accounted for 53.8% (up from 51.3% in November 2015) and advanced by 13.9%. Exports to **non-EU countries** accounted for 32.3% of total exports (down from 33.7% in November 2015) as they rose by 3.8% year-on-year.

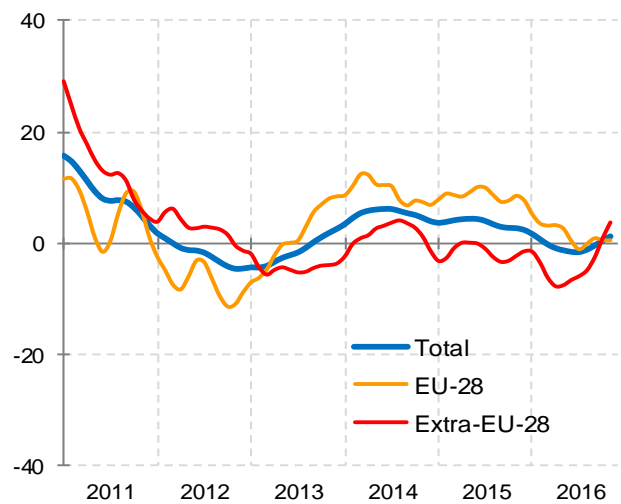


Imports from the **European Union** accounted for 57.4% of total imports in November 2016 (down from 58.7% in November 2015) and went up by 3.0% year-on-year. Imports from the **euro area** represented 46.3% (down from 46.7% in November 2015) and increased by 4.3%. Imports from **non-EU countries** accounted for 42.6% of total imports in November 2016 (up from 41.3% in November 2015) as they advanced by 8.6% year-on-year.

Exports EU and extra-EU (% y-o-y trend-cycle)



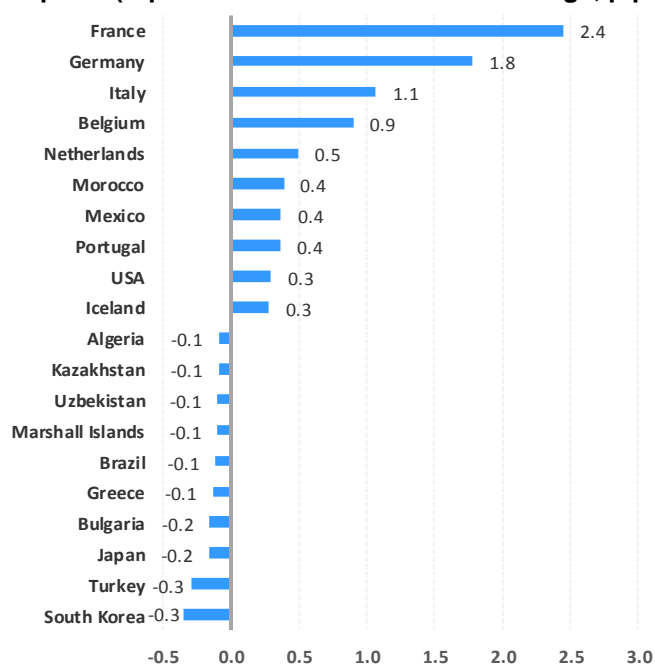
Imports EU and extra-EU (% y-o-y trend-cycle)



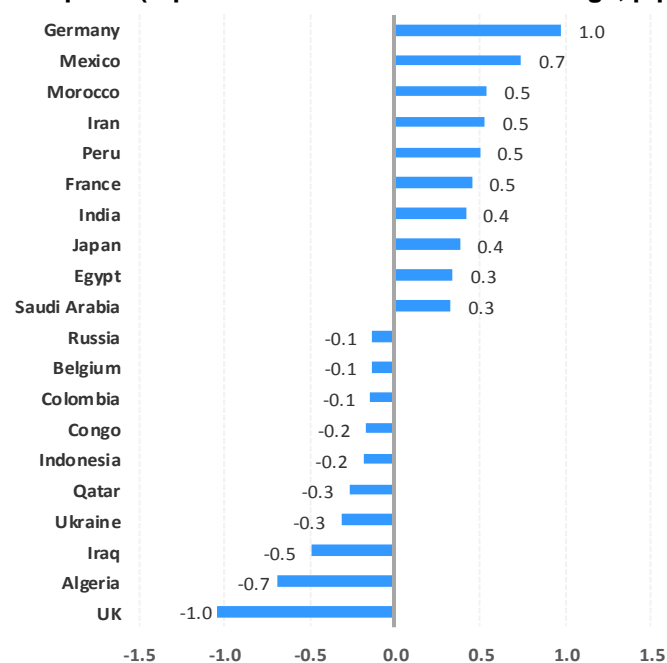
**Trade balance with the European Union** showed in November 2016 a surplus of 1,711.6 million euros (up from a surplus of 554.5 million in November 2015) and a surplus of 1,199.5 million euros with the euro area (129.5 million surplus in November 2015). **Trade deficit with the rest of the world** increased to 2,957.9 million euros (from a deficit of 2,404.2 million euros in November 2015).

The **destinations with the largest contributions** to the annual change in Spain's **exports** in November 2016 (up by 8.5%) were France (2.4 percentage points), Germany (1.8 points), Italy (1.1 points) and Belgium (0.9 points). Those destinations with the largest negative contributions were South Korea (-0.3 points), Turkey (-0.3 points), Japan (-0.2 points) and Bulgaria (-0.2 points).

Regarding **imports**, the **countries with the largest contributions** to the annual change in Spain's **imports** in November 2016 (up by 5.3%) were Germany (1.0 percentage points), Mexico (0.7 points), Morocco (0.5 points) and Iran (0.5 points). The destinations with the largest negative contributions were United Kingdom (-1.0 points), Algeria (-0.7 points), Iraq (-0.5 points) and Ukraine (-0.3 points).

### International data

**In comparison to other geographical areas**, Spain's exports of goods advanced by 8.5% year-on-year in November, a higher increase than those of the euro area (5.7%) and the European Union (4.9%). Within the European Union, exports also increased in Italy (5.7%), Germany (5.6%), France (1.4%) and in the United Kingdom (16.3%). Outside the European Union, the United States exports increased by 2.6% but China's and Japan's exports decreased by 1.5% and 0.4% respectively.



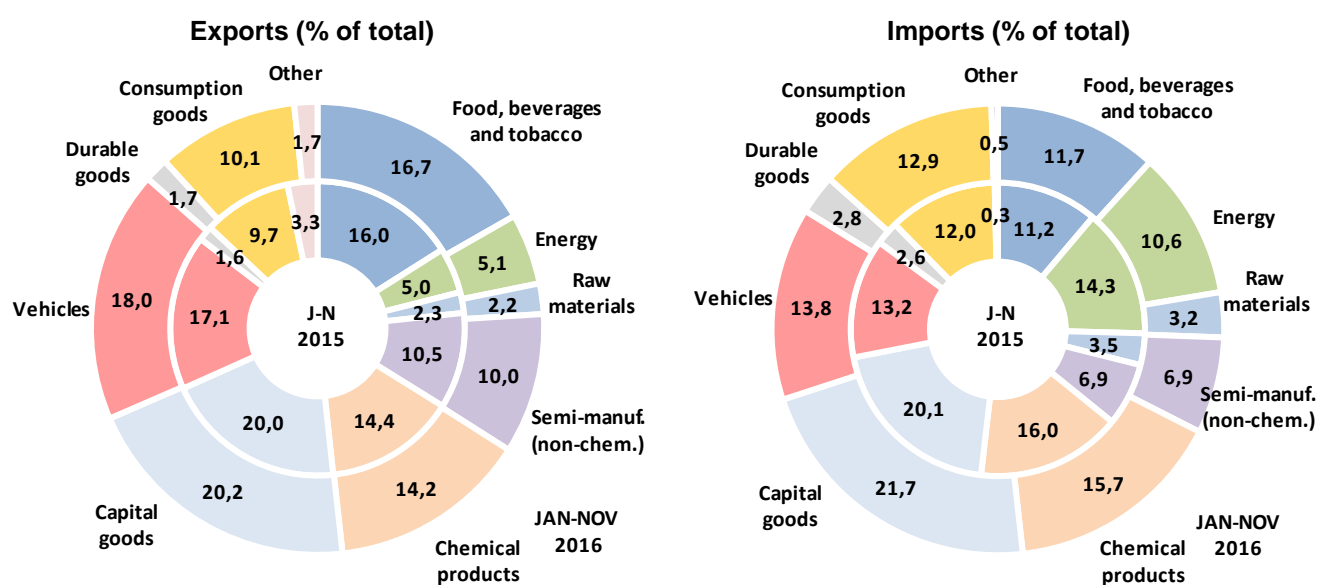
## JANUARY – NOVEMBER 2016

**Spain's exports grew by 1.6%** in the period of January-November 2016 compared to the same period of 2015 to 233,798.9 million euros, whereas imports shrank by 0.9% year-on-year to 250,106.0 million euros. In real terms, exports expanded by 3.6% year-on-year, as export prices fell by 1.9%, and imports grew by 2.8% year-on-year, as import prices decreased by 3.6%.

**Spain's trade deficit** diminished to 16,307.0 million euros compared to the same period of 2015 (deficit of 22,379.9 million euros). The export/import **coverage ratio** reached 93.5%, 2.4 percentage points higher than in the same period of 2015 (91.1%, provisional data). The **non-energy trade balance** reached a deficit of 1,605.4 million euros, compared to a surplus of 2,121.4 million euros in January-November 2015, whereas the **energy trade deficit** declined by 40.0% year-on-year to 14,701.6 million euros.

### Sectoral data

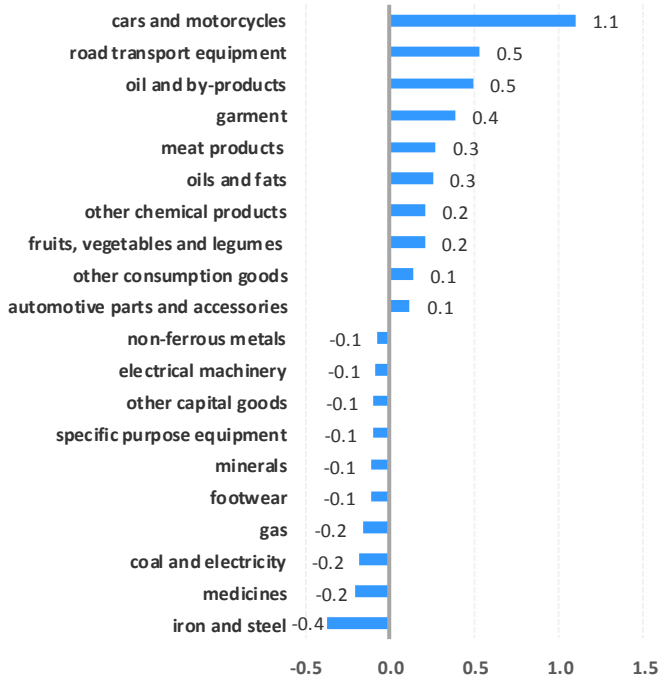
Spain's **main exporting sectors** in the period of January-November were *capital goods* (representing 20.2% of total exports, growing by 2.9% year-on-year), *vehicles* (18.0% of total, rising by 7.1%), *food, beverages and tobacco* (16.7% of total, surging by 6.1%) and *chemical products* (14.2% of total, remaining constant).



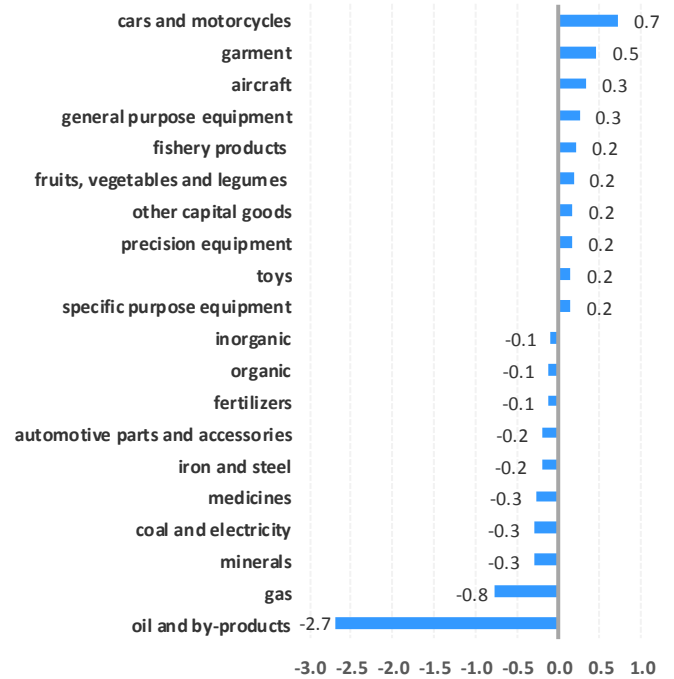
The **largest shares by sector of Spain's imports** were those of *capital goods* (representing 21.7% of total and growing by 7.1% year-on-year), *chemical products* (15.7% of total imports, declining by 2.5%), *vehicles* (13.8% of total imports, advancing by 4.1%) and *consumption goods* (12.9% of total imports, rising by 6.8%).

Among **subsectors**, the largest contributions to the annual change in Spain's **exports** (up by 1.6%) were *cars and motorcycles* (1.1 percentage points), *road transport equipment* (0.5 points) and *oil and by-products* (0.5 points). On the other hand, the major negative contributions by subsectors corresponded to *iron and steel* (-0.4 points), *medicines* (-0.2 points), and *coal and electricity* (-0.2 points).

**Exports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)**



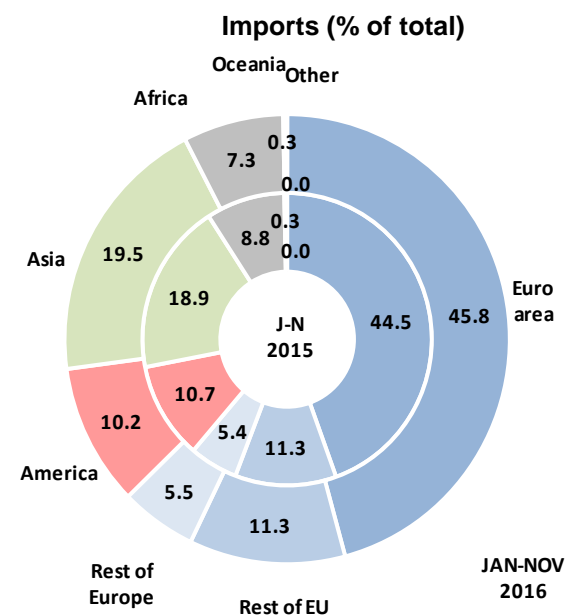
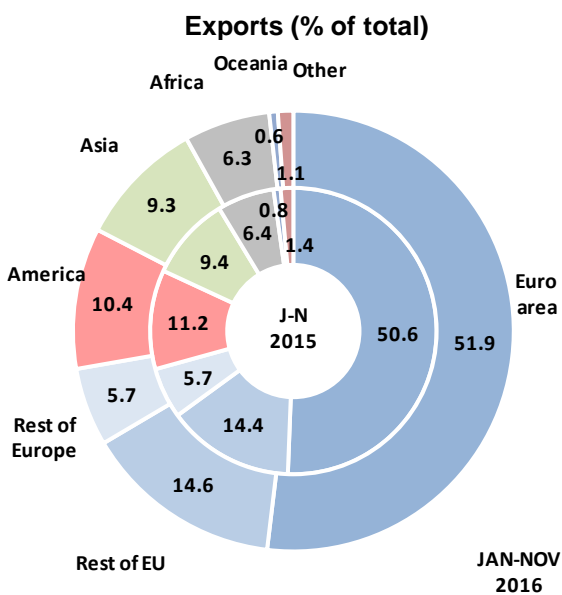
**Imports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)**



The **subsectors with most positive contributions** to the annual change in Spain's imports in January-November 2016 (down by 0.9%) were *cars and motorcycles* (0.7 points), *garment* (0.5 points) and *aircraft* (0.3 points). The major negative contributions corresponded to *oil and by-products* (-2.7 points), *gas* (-0.8 points) and *minerals* (-0.3 points).

**Geographic data**

Exports to the **European Union** accounted for 66.5% of total exports in the period (up from 65.0% in the same period of 2015) and went up by 4.0% year-on-year, while exports to the **euro area** accounted for 51.9% of total (50.6% in the same period of 2015) and grew by 4.2%. Exports to the **rest of the world** accounted for 33.5% of total exports (35.0% in the same period of 2015) and fell by 2.8% year-on-year.

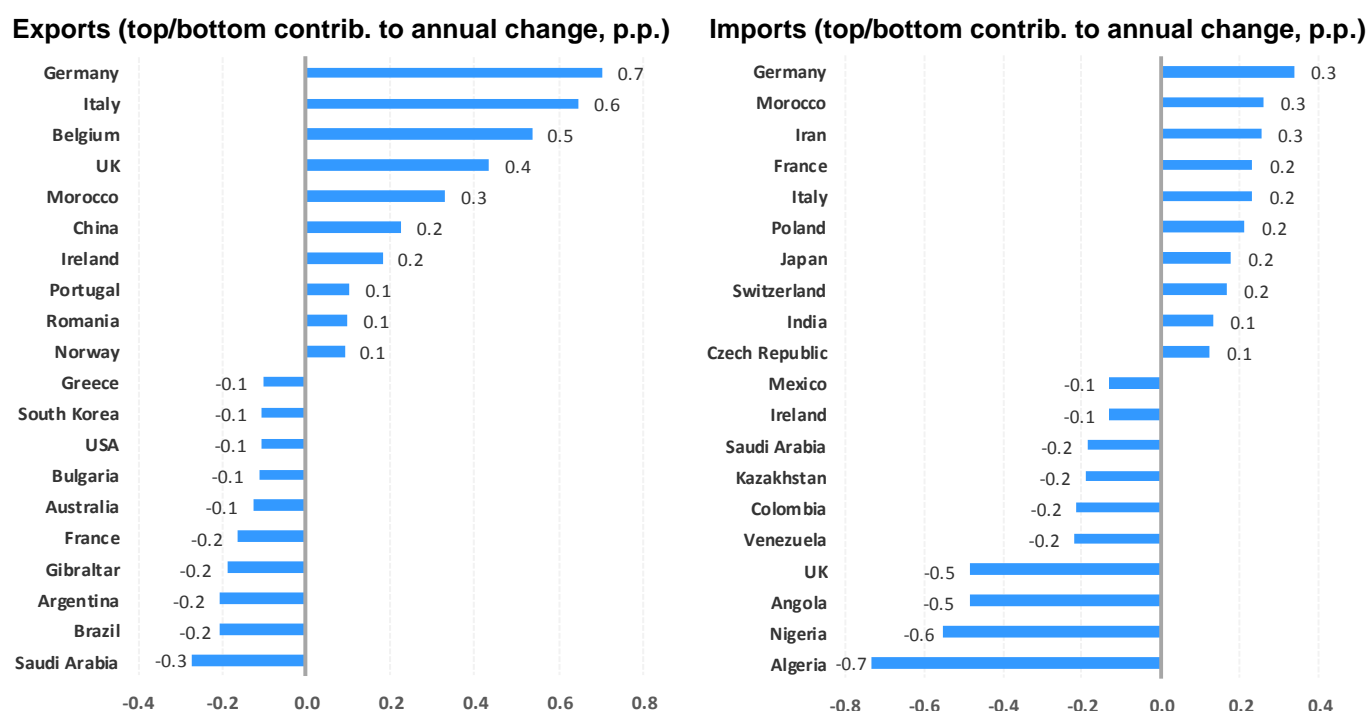


Imports from the **European Union** accounted for 57.1% of total imports in January-November 2016 (up from 55.8% in the same period of 2015) and grew by 1.4% year-on-year. Imports from the **euro area**

accounted for 45.8% (44.5% in the same period of 2015) and grew by 1.9%. Imports from the **rest of the world** accounted for 42.9% of total (44.2% in the same period of 2015) and fell by 3.9% year-on-year.

**Spain's trade surplus with the European Union and with the euro area** increased to 12,570.2 million euros and to 6,816.3 million euros respectively, up from surpluses of 8,567.0 million and 4,096.0 million euros in the same period of the previous year. The **trade deficit with the rest of the world** decreased by 6.7% year-on-year to 28,877.2 million euros.

In terms of **contribution to the annual change of exports** (up by 1.6%), the main contributions were those of Germany (0.7 percentage points), Italy (0.6 points), Belgium (0.5 points) and United Kingdom (0.4 points). Those destinations with the largest negative contributions were Saudi Arabia (-0.3 points), Brazil (-0.2 points), Argentina (-0.2 points) and Gibraltar (-0.2 points).



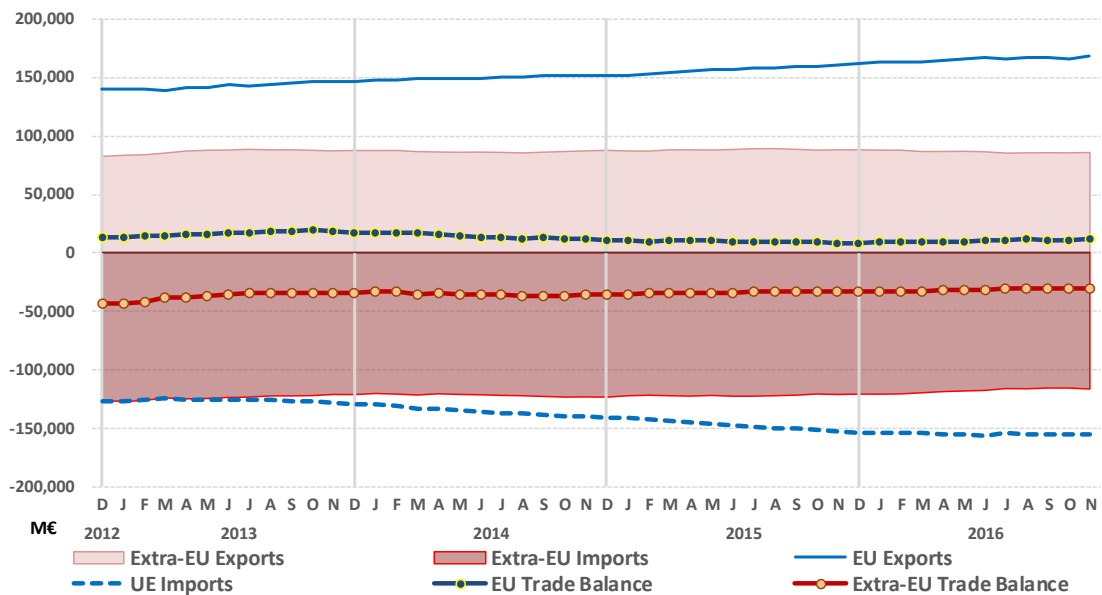
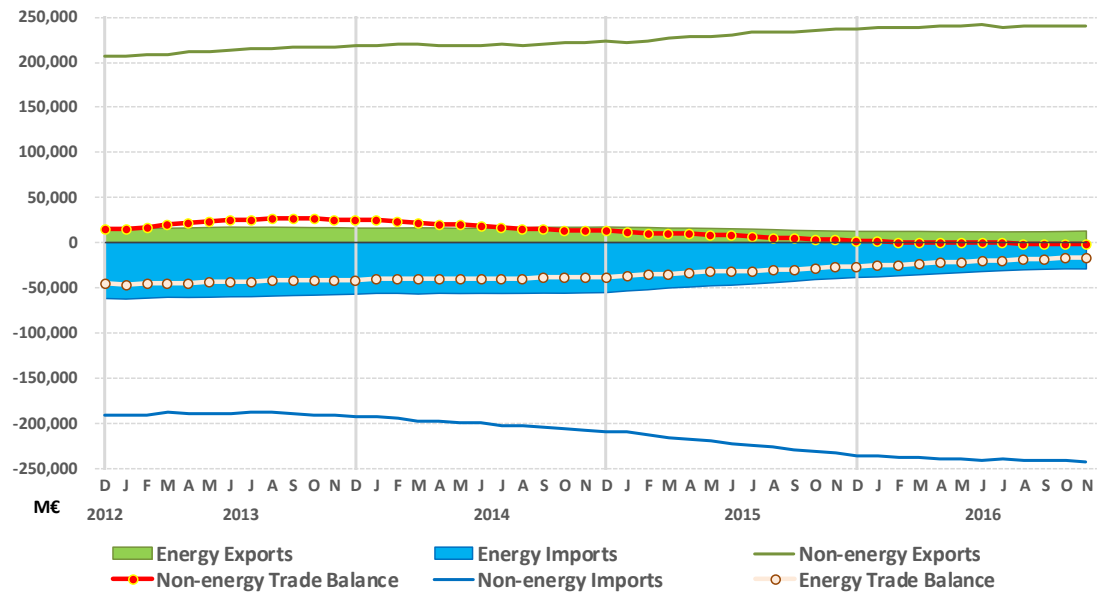
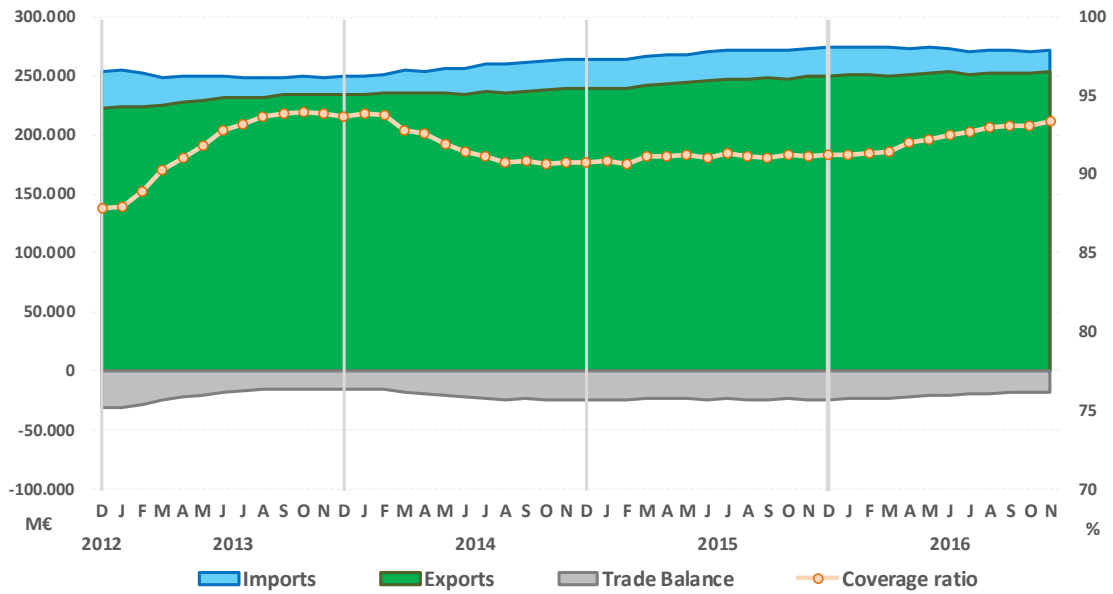
Regarding **imports**, the **countries with the largest contribution** to the annual change in Spain's imports in the period (down by 0.9%) were Germany (0.3 percentage points), Morocco (0.3 points), Iran (0.3 points) and France (0.2 points). The destinations with the largest negative contributions were Algeria (-0.7 points), Nigeria (-0.6 points), Angola (-0.5 points) and United Kingdom (-0.5 points).

In the period January-November, the number of **Spanish exporters** expanded by 1.1% year-on-year to 141,536 exporters, out of which 37,270 had already exported at least 50,000 euros worth of goods in the period, 0.5% less than in the same period of 2015. With regard to regular exporters (those that have already exported in the current year as well as in each of the three preceding years), they amounted to 49,368 in the period, 34.9% of total exporters and 4.2% more than in the same period of 2015. Their exports reached 220,707.4 million, 94.4% of total exports and 2.6% more than in the same period of the previous year.

## International data

**In comparison to other geographical areas**, Spain's exports of goods grew by 1.6% year-on-year in the period of January-November 2016, a higher rate than that attained by the euro area (0.2%). By contrast, the European Union's exports fell by 0.6%. Within the European Union, exports grew in Germany (0.8%) and Italy (0.7%), whereas those of France and the United Kingdom shrank (-1.8% and -1.5% respectively). Outside the European Union, the United States exports fell by 4.0%, China's by 6.4% and Japan's by 8.5%.
