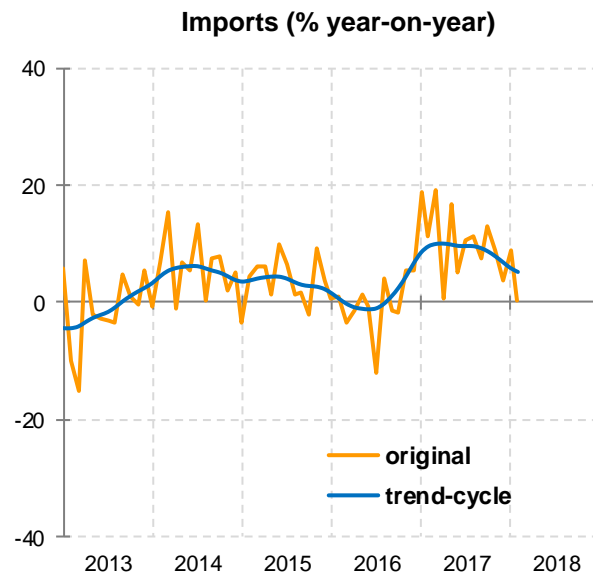
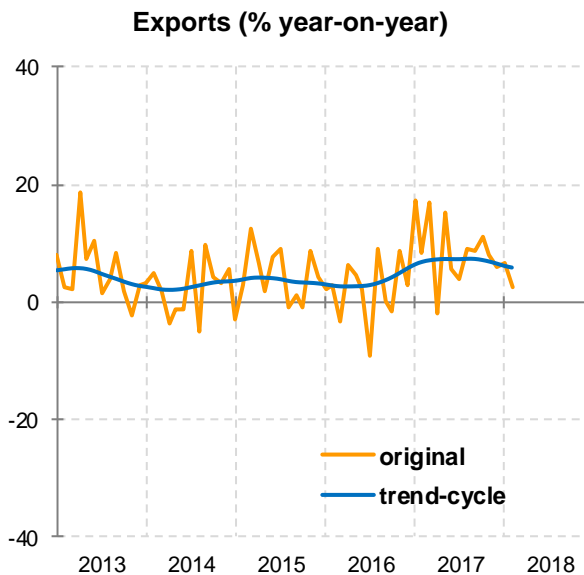

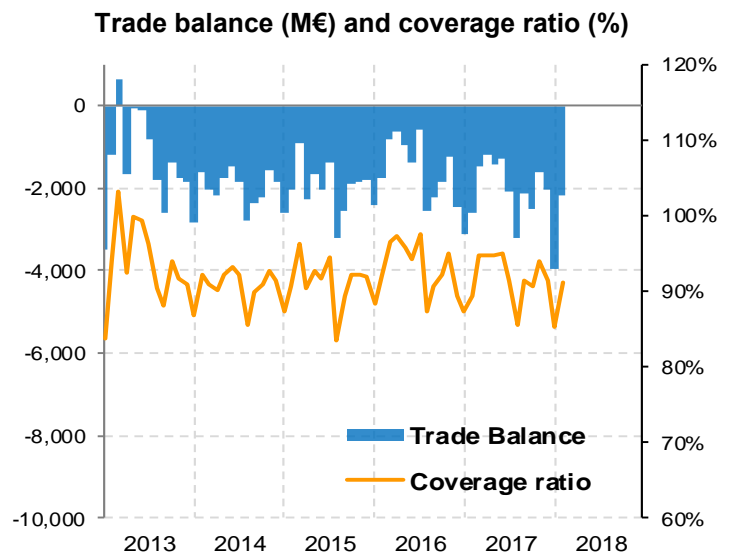


## FEBRUARY 2018

In February 2018, **Spain's exports advanced by 2.3%** year-on-year in nominal terms to 22,589.5 million euros, and **imports grew by 0.3%** to 24,756.8 million euros. With seasonally adjusted data, exports increased by 2.5% year-on-year, and imports by 0.4%. In **real terms**, exports expanded by 0.3% year-on-year, as export prices augmented by 2.1%, and imports advanced by 0.2%, as import prices grew by 0.1%. In nominal terms on a **month-on-month** basis, exports decreased by 1.1%, and imports diminished by 7.5%. With seasonally adjusted data, exports fell by 1.8% month-on-month, and imports by 2.7%.

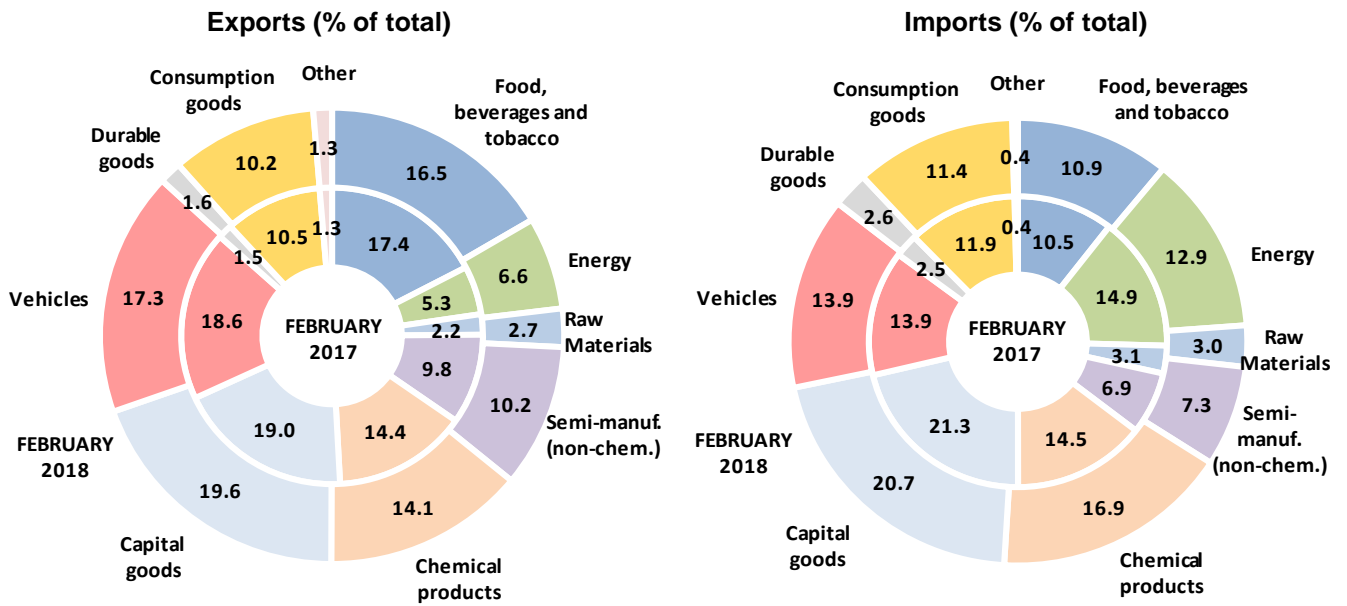


Spain's **trade balance** registered a deficit of 2,167.3 million euros, down from a deficit of 2,606.0 million euros in February 2017 (provisional data). The export/import **coverage ratio** reached 91.2%, 1.8 percentage points higher than in the same month of 2017 (89.4% in February 2017 with provisional data). The **non-energy trade balance** reached a deficit of 455.8 million euros, from a deficit of 85.2 million in the same month of 2017. The **energy trade deficit** fell by 32.1% year-on-year to 1,711.5 million euros (compared to a deficit of 2,520.8 million euros in February 2017).



### Sectoral data

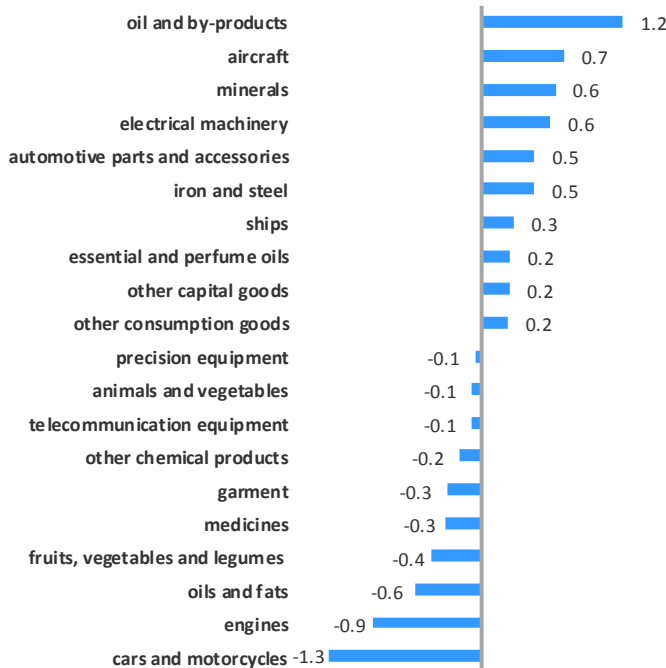
Spain's **main exporting sectors** in February 2018 were *capital goods* (representing 19.6% of total exports and rising by 5.5% year-on-year), *vehicles* (17.3% of total, shrinking by 4.6%), *food, beverages and tobacco* (16.5% of total, declining by 2.6%) and *chemical products* (14.1% of total, remained stable).



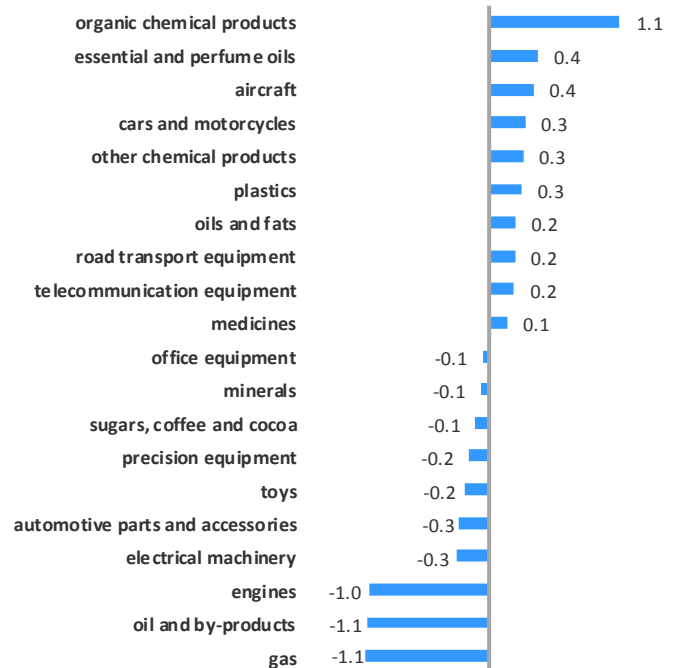
The most significant sectors of Spain's imports were *capital goods* (representing 20.7% of total imports and falling by 2.4% year-on-year), *chemical products* (16.9% of total, advancing by 16.4%), *vehicles* (13.9% of total, growing by 0.3%) and *energy* (12.9% of total, diminishing by 13.4%).

Among subsectors, the largest contributions to the annual change in Spain's exports in February 2018 (up by 2.3%) came from *oil and by-products* (1.2 points), *aircraft* (0.7 points) and *minerals* (0.6 points). The major negative contributions corresponded to *cars and motorcycles* (-1.3 points), *engines* (-0.9 points) and *oils and fats* (-0.6 points).

Exports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)



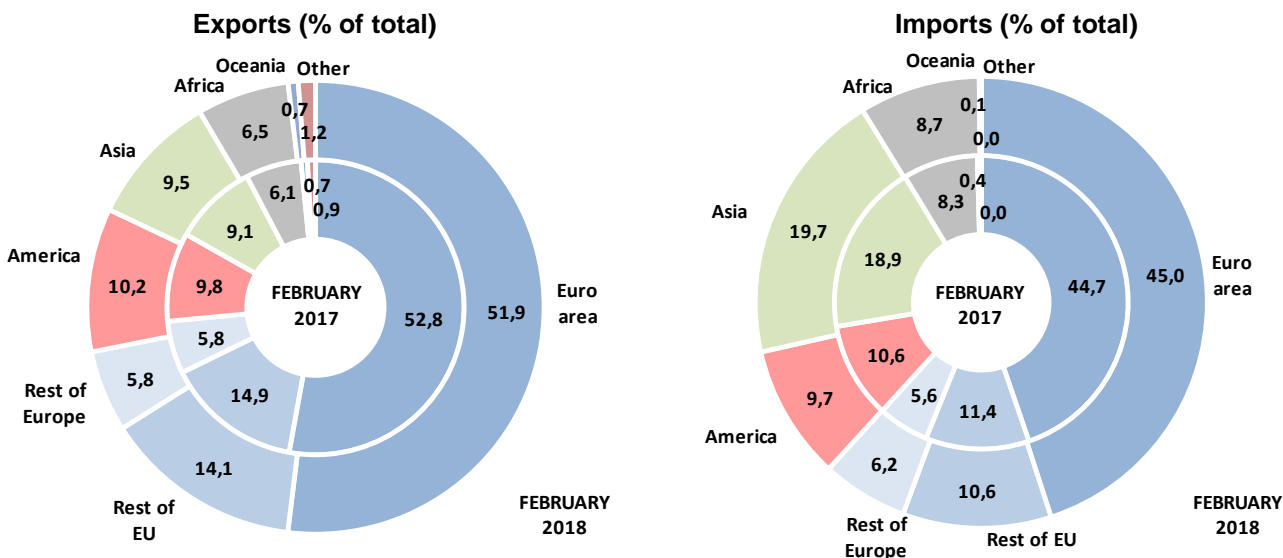
Imports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)



The subsectors with the most positive contribution to the annual change in Spain's imports in February 2018 (up by 0.3%) were *organic chemical products* (1.1 points), *essential and perfume oils* (0.4 points) and *aircraft* (0.4 points). The major negative contributions corresponded to *gas* (-1.1 points), *oil and by-products* (-1.1 points) and *engines* (-1.0 points).

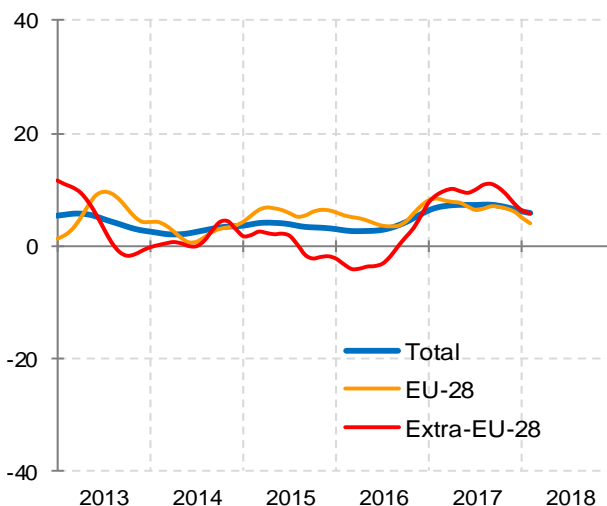
## Geographic data

Exports to the **European Union** accounted for 66.0% of total exports in February 2018 (down from 67.7% in February 2017) and diminished by 0.2% year-on-year. Exports to the **euro area** ran at 51.9% (down from 52.8% in February 2017) and increased by 0.6%. Exports to **non-EU countries** represented 34.0% of total exports (up from 32.3% in February 2017) as they went up by 7.6% year-on-year.

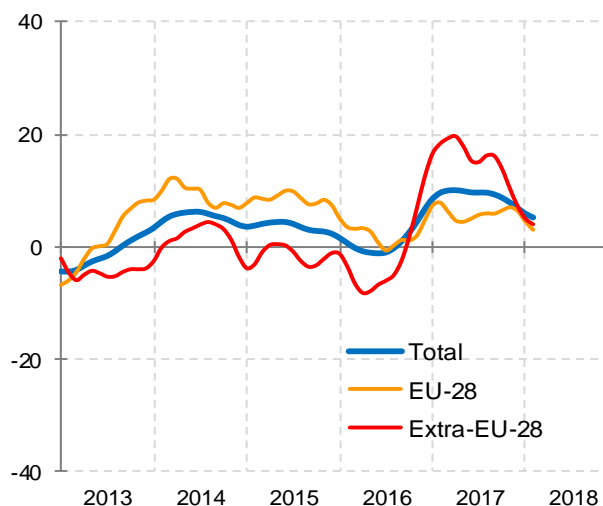


Imports from the **European Union** amounted to 55.6% of total imports in February 2018 (down from 56.1% in February 2017) and fell by 0.6% year-on-year. Imports from the **euro area** represented 45.0% (up from 44.7% in February 2017) and augmented by 0.9%. Imports from **non-EU countries** accounted for 44.4% of total imports in February 2018 (up from 43.9% in February 2017) as they advanced by 1.5% year-on-year.

### Exports EU and extra-EU (% y-o-y trend-cycle)



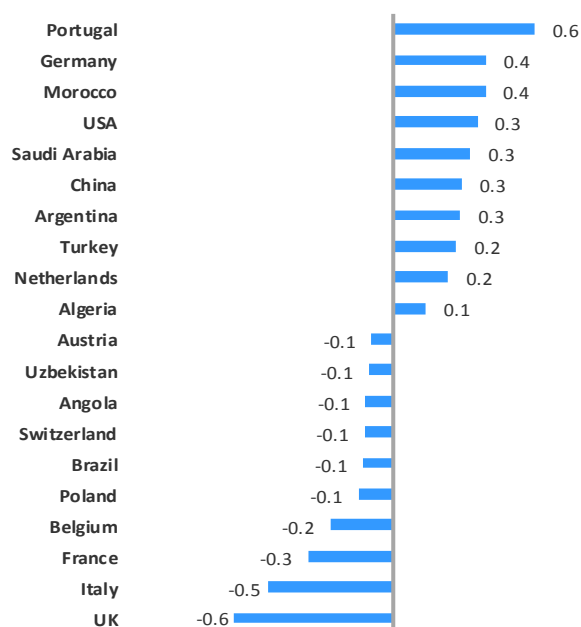
### Imports EU and extra-EU (% y-o-y trend-cycle)



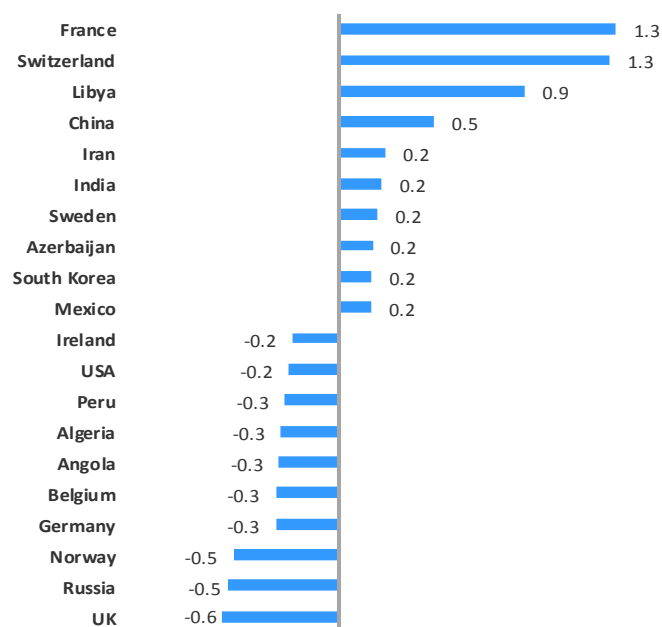
**Trade balance with the European Union** showed in February 2018 a surplus of 1,145.2 million euros (up from a surplus of 1,092.9 million in February 2017) and a surplus of 592.9 million euros with the euro area (622.6 million surplus in February 2017). **Trade deficit with the rest of the world** decreased to 3,312.5 million euros (from a deficit of 3,698.9 million euros in February 2017).

The **destinations with the largest contributions** to the annual change in Spain's **exports** in February 2018 (up by 2.3%) were Portugal (0.6 percentage points), Germany (0.4 points), Morocco (0.4 points) and the United States (0.3 points). Those destinations with the largest negative contributions were the United Kingdom (-0.6 points), Italy (-0.5 points), France (-0.3 points) and Belgium (-0.2 points).

Regarding **imports**, the **countries with the largest contributions** to the annual change in Spain's **imports** in February 2018 (up by 0.3%) were France (1.3 percentage points), Switzerland (1.3 points), Libya (0.9 points) and China (0.5 points). The destinations with the largest negative contributions were the United Kingdom (-0.6 points), Russia (-0.5 points), Norway (-0.5 points) and Germany (-0.3 points).

### International data

**In comparison to other geographical areas**, Spain's exports of goods expanded by 2.3% year-on-year in February, a lower increase than those of the euro area (3.4%) and the European Union (2.9%). Within the European Union, exports also increased in Germany (2.4%), France (3.5%), Italy (3.9%) and the United Kingdom (0.8%). Outside the European Union, the United States exports advanced by 7.4% year-on-year and Japan's by 1.8%.



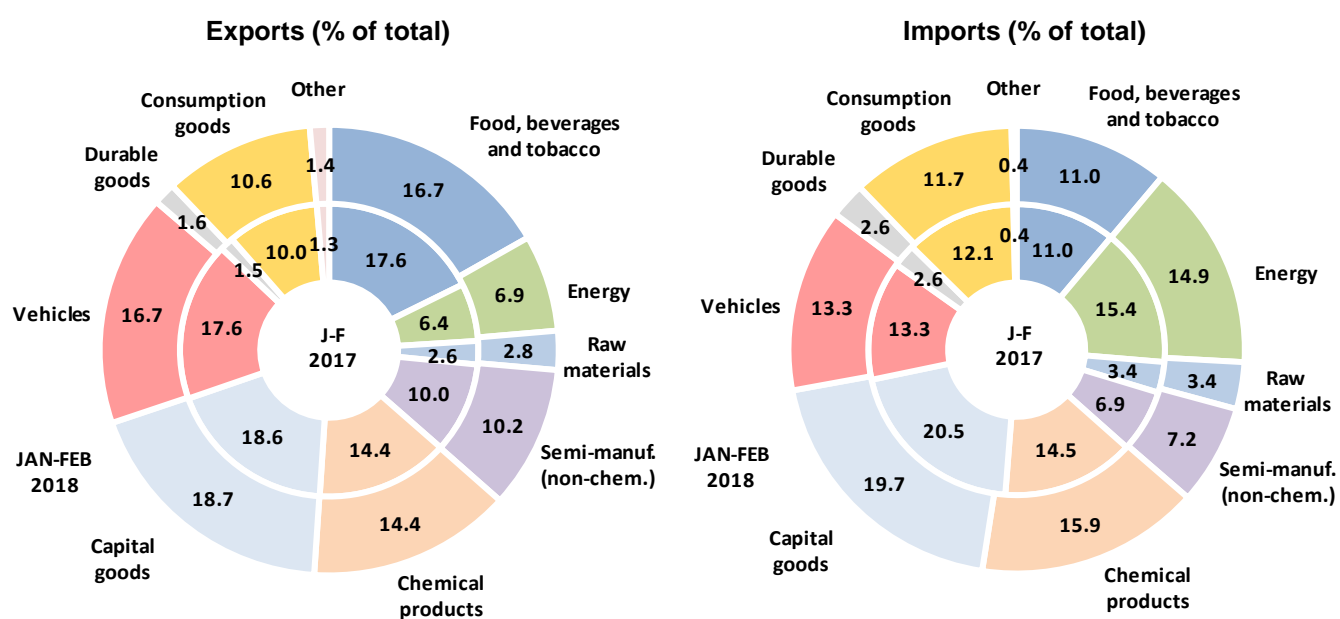
## JANUARY – FEBRUARY 2018

**Spain's exports augmented by 4.4%** in the period of January-February 2018 compared to the same period of 2017 to 45,419.2 million euros, and **imports increased by 4.6%** year-on-year to 51,521.9 million euros. In real terms, exports rose by 2.3% year-on-year, as export prices expanded by 2.0%, and imports advanced by 3.4% year-on-year, as import prices grew by 1.2%.

**Spain's trade deficit** increased to 6,102.7 million euros compared to the same period of 2017 (deficit of 5,740.7 million euros). The export/import **coverage ratio** reached 88.2%, 0.2 percentage points lower than in the same period of 2017 (88.3%, provisional data). The **non-energy trade balance** reached a deficit of 1,580.2 million euros, compared to a deficit of 940.3 million euros in January-February 2017, whereas the **energy trade deficit** decreased by 5.8% year-on-year to 4,522.5 million euros.

### Sectoral data

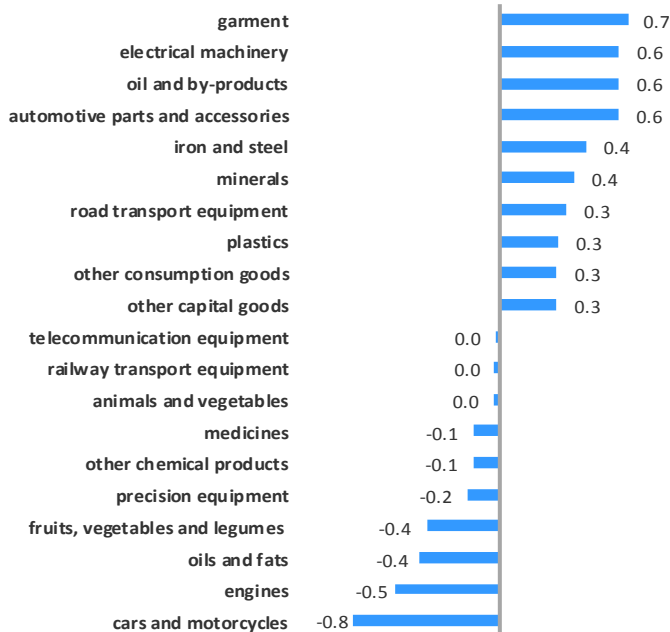
Spain's **main exporting sectors** in the period of January-February were *capital goods* (representing 18.7% of total exports, rising by 4.9% year-on-year), *vehicles* (16.7% of total, falling by 0.9%), *food, beverages and tobacco* (16.7% of total, diminishing by 1.1%) and *chemical products* (14.4% of total, growing by 4.2%).



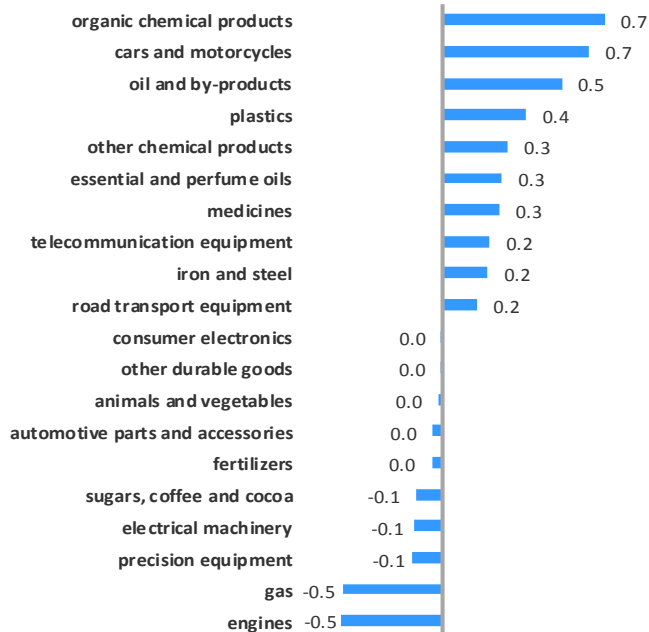
The **largest shares by sector of Spain's imports** were those of *capital goods* (representing 19.7% of total and expanding by 0.5% year-on-year), *chemical products* (15.9% of total imports, surging by 14.8%), *energy* (14.9% of total imports, increasing by 1.2%) and *vehicles* (13.3% of total imports, advancing by 4.8%).

Among **subsectors**, the largest contributions to the annual change in Spain's **exports** (up by 4.4%) were *garment* (0.7 percentage points), *electrical machinery* (0.6 points) and *oil and by-products* (0.6 points). On the other hand, the major negative contributions by subsectors corresponded to *cars and motorcycles* (-0.8 points), *engines* (-0.5 points), and *oils and fats* (-0.4 points).

**Exports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)**



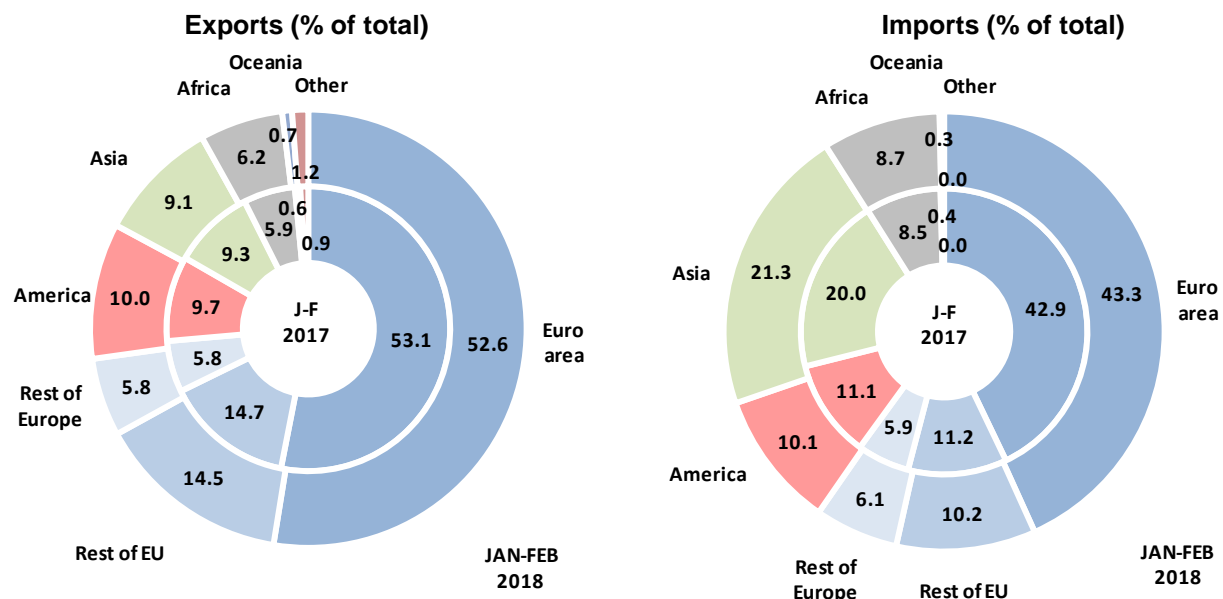
**Imports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)**



The **subsectors with the most positive contributions** to the annual change in Spain's **imports** in January-February 2018 (up by 4.6%) were *organic chemical products* (0.7 points), *cars and motorcycles* (0.7 points) and *oil and by-products* (0.5 points). The major negative contributions corresponded to *engines* (-0.5 points), *gas* (-0.5 points) and *precision equipment* (-0.1 points).

**Geographic data**

Exports to the **European Union** represented 67.0% of total exports in the period (down from 67.8% in the same period of 2017) and increased by 3.2% year-on-year, and exports to the **euro area** ran at 52.6% of total (53.1% in the same period of 2017) and advanced by 3.3%. Exports to the **rest of the world** amounted to 33.0% of total exports (32.2% in the same period of 2017) and expanded by 6.8% year-on-year.



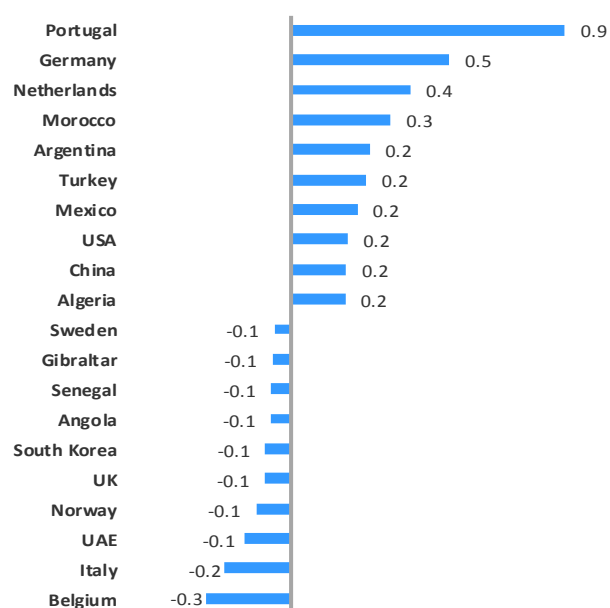
Imports from the **European Union** accounted for 53.5% of total imports in January-February 2018 (down from 54.1% in the same period of 2017) and grew by 3.5% year-on-year. Imports from the **euro area** amounted to 43.3% (42.9% in the same period of 2017) and advanced by 5.5%. Imports from the **rest of**

the world ran at 46.5% of total imports (45.9% in the same period of 2017) and went up by 5.9% year-on-year.

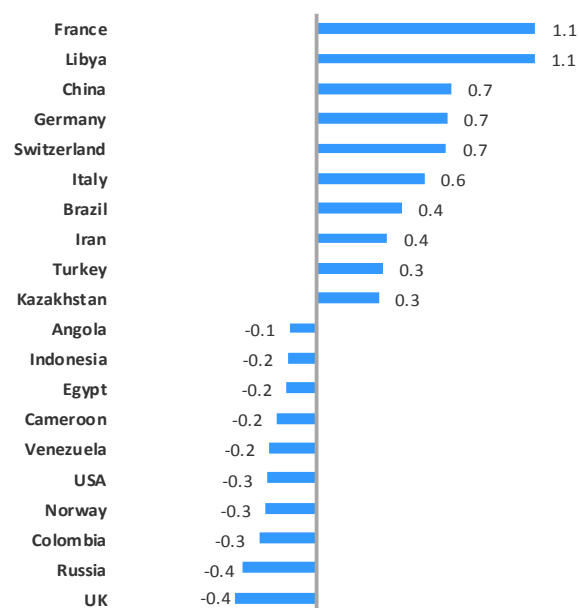
Spain's trade surplus with the European Union and with the euro area reached 2,873.2 million euros and 1,585.8 million euros respectively, up from a surplus of 2,864.8 million and down from a surplus of 1,975.3 million euros in the same period of the previous year. The trade deficit with the rest of the world increased by 4.3% year-on-year to 8,975.9 million euros.

In terms of contribution to the annual change of exports (up by 4.4%), the main contributions were those of Portugal (0.9 percentage points), Germany (0.5 points), the Netherlands (0.4 points) and Morocco (0.3 points). Those destinations with the largest negative contributions were Belgium (-0.3 points), Italy (-0.2 points), United Arab Emirates (-0.1 points) and Norway (-0.1 points).

#### Imports (top/bottom contrib. to annual change, p.p.)



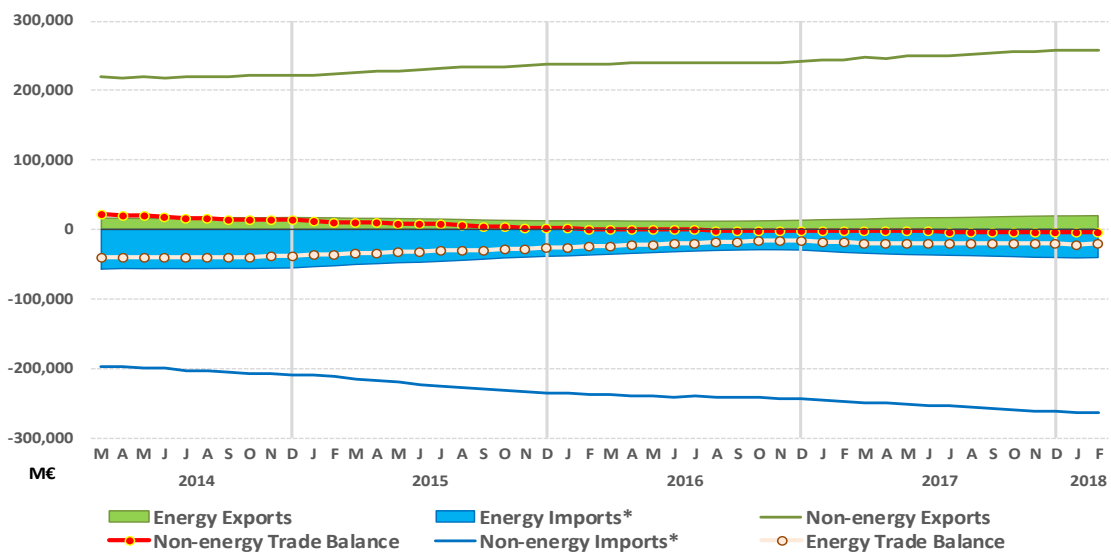
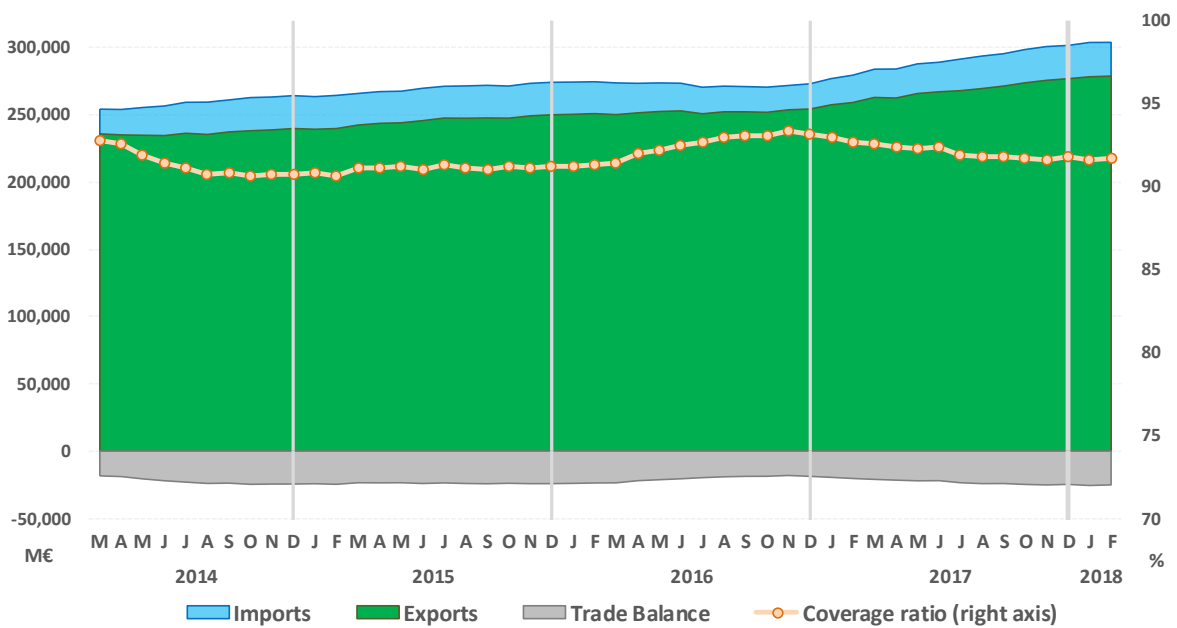
Regarding imports, the countries with the largest contribution to the annual change in Spain's imports in the period (up by 4.6%) were France (1.1 percentage points), Libya (1.1 points), China (0.7 points) and Germany (0.7 points). The destinations with the largest negative contributions were the United Kingdom (-0.4 points), Russia (-0.4 points), Colombia (-0.3 points), Norway (-0.3 points) and the United States (-0.3 points).

In the period January-February, the number of Spanish exporters grew by 19.4% year-on-year to 74,795 exporters, out of which 21,688 had already exported at least 50,000 euros worth of goods in the period, 0.2% less than in the same period of 2017. With regard to regular exporters (those that have already exported in the current year as well as in each of the three preceding years), they amounted to 39,212 in the period, 52.4% of total exporters and 1.4% more than in the same period of 2017. Their exports reached 43,709.1 million, 96.2% of total exports and 5.0% more than in the same period of the previous year.

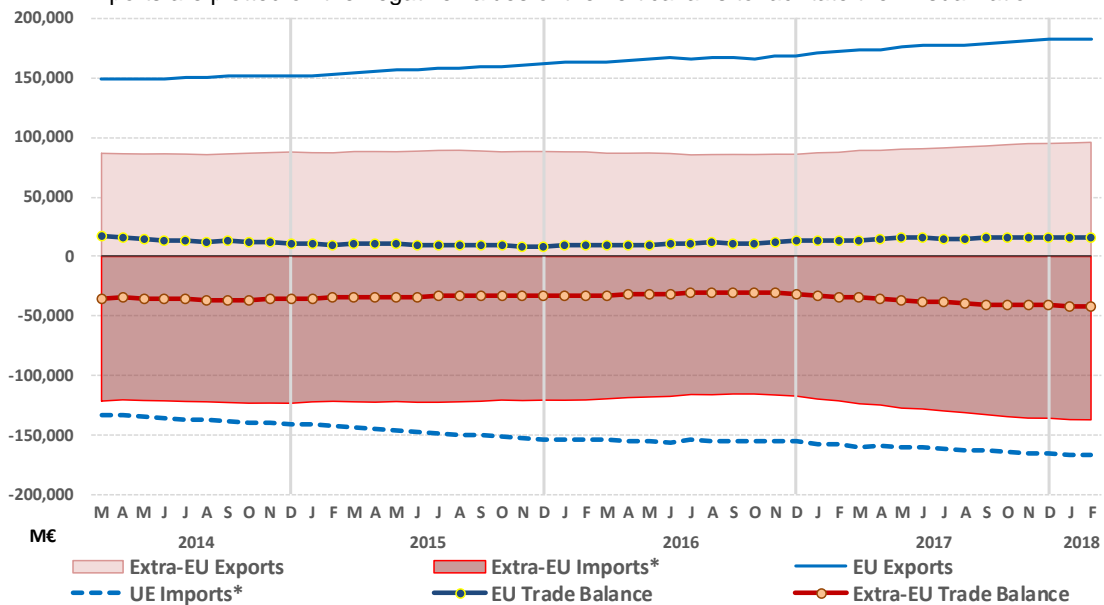
### International data

In comparison to other geographical areas, Spain's exports of goods augmented by 4.4% year-on-year in the period of January-February 2018, a lower rate than those attained by the euro area (6.2%) and the European Union (5.7%). Within the European Union, exports also increased in Germany (5.4%), France (5.8%), Italy (6.6%) and the United Kingdom (2.4%). Outside the European Union, the United States exports increased by 6.8% year-on-year and Japan's by 6.6%.
